

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**ORDER**

During the month of August, 2018 devastating floods affected the entire state of Kerala, due to unusually high rainfall during the monsoon season. The Government have conducted massive rescue and relief operations by mobilising all resources. The Government is in the process of launching a comprehensive rehabilitation and rebuilding process to mitigate the sufferings of the people with the active help and support from across the Globe.

In its stride to Re-Build Kerala Initiative, KPMG in India has been identified as Partner Consultant for the Development Consulting Model. KPMG in India is one of the leading providers of risk, financial and business advisory services and corporate governance.

## ANNEXURE


**The Identified Intervention areas .**

1. Considering Kerala as a single geography, an outline for developing Ernakulam/Kochi as the central business district of the region to accelerate the pace of economic development in the city. This may also explore linkages to parts of Alappuzha which could form a larger beneficiary catchment area.
2. A program for sustainable use of the entire water body network in Alappuzha including the Vembanad lake, Kuttanad and the Canal system of Alappuzha for Agriculture, Drinking water, Irrigation, Tourism etc.
3. Iconic projects of Re-Build Kerala in all the 14 districts in which the NRIs (especially of Kerala origin) contribute through a crowd funding program.
4. A comprehensive development plan for Thiruvananthapuram based on the already initiated projects, upon detailed local need assessment.
5. A similar development plan for Kozhikode depending upon the detailed local need assessment.
6. A framework for environmentally sustainable development in Wayanad and Idukki districts including resettlement of people from land slide prone/geo-sensitive areas.
7. Considering the yeoman service provided by the fishermen, a comprehensive rehabilitation plan for the fishermen habitation. The program envisages relocating dwelling units in the buffer zone identified based on the prior experiences with respect to erosion which resulted in property damage to the landward side of the coastal road. This will be a distinct departure from the practice so far followed in Kerala of constructing seawalls and continuing to make the fisherman vulnerable to sea erosion.

**Role definition of KPMG**

1. Get concurrence of other consultants for pro-bono work.
2. Map the other consultants based on the depth of their functional competence and earmarked allotted area.
3. The intervention areas to be focused, set out the contours of each of the above and set the ToR for other consultants.
4. Work closely with the consultants to ensure that the outcome document is as per Government's expectations.
5. Create an appraisal framework for the proposals by other consultants.
6. Prepare a framework for future engagement as a Project Management Consultant (PMC).
7. KPMG in India had evinced interest on taking up water bodies in Alappuzha and the fishermen community relocation. The Government will allocate suitable areas to KPMG in India and other consultants based on their strengths and specific orders will be issued in this regard separately.
