

This file deals with the process of notifying selected areas in the State as 'Scheduled Areas' on the basis of the criteria defined as per Panchayath Extension of Scheduled Areas Act, 1996 (PESA Act '96). The purpose of implementing this Act in the State is the empowerment of the ST people. This Act ensure special powers to the Grama Sabha of the Scheduled Area in the matters like Liquor ban, Minor Forest Produce, Prevention of the transfer of Land owned by the Scheduled Tribes, control of the local markets and financial institutions in the area etc.

Along with the above, under this Act the Gramasabha will be empowered for the following:

- Approval of the scheme/programmes for the socio-economical development of the ST people.
- the beneficiaries of poverty eradication Selection programme.
- Conservation of natural resources etc.
- (2) As per 2011 Census, the estimated Scheduled Tribes population of Kerala is 4,85,715. It is seen that 95% of the above population are residing at Forest areas. Attappady Block (42.95%) in Palakkad District, Idamalakkudy Panchayath (100%) in Idukki District, Thirunelli (44.38%) and Noolpuzha Panchayath (40.36%) in Wayanad District are

the most densely ST populated Areas in the State.

In order to protect the rights of the ST people and also to address their grievances, Government consider the interests of the ST people seriously and are planning to empower the ST people by notifying the densely ST populated areas as 'Schedules Areas' as envisaged in the PESA Act.

As per the letter dated 01-01-2018, from the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Govt of India, the criteria for notifying a particular area as scheduled area are as follows:

- (1) Considerable ST population.
- (2) Convenient and Suitable Administration Area (Taluk, Village, Block, Panchayath etc).
- (3) Under developed area.
- (4) Economically backward condition compared to the adjacent areas.

In connection with the implementation of PESA Act in Kerala, on 17.12.2014, the Council of Ministers decided to include the following ST populated areas under the PESA Act.

- (1) All ST Hamlets in Wayanad District along with Noolpuzha and Thirunelly Panchayath.
- (2) Idamalakkudi Panchayath in Idukki.
- (3) Aralam resettlement area in Kannur District.
- (4) Attappady Block in Palakkad District.

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(5) Amarambalam, Karulai, Vazhikkadav areas in Nilambur, Malappuram District.

In accordance with the above, a notification for publishing in the Gazette was prepared and forwarded to the MoTA, Government of India from H.E. the Governor, State of Kerala on 23.01.2015. The MoTA returned the above notification with suggestions for modification of the same. The notification for implementing PESA Act has been modified as suggested by the MoTA.

Meanwhile, the incumbent Government came into existence and the matter was brought to the attention of the Hon'ble Minister for SC/ST and it was observed that since the geographical distribution of ST populated area in the State will create practical difficulties for the implementation of PESA Act, guidelines should be formulated to include/exclude a particular area under the Local Self Government Institutions. The Hon'ble Minister ordered to constitute a Higher Level Committee for the above purpose. Accordingly, vide GO(Ms)No.38/2017/SCSTDD dated 17.05.2017 a Higher Level Committee was constituted with the Secretaries in SC/ST Development Department, Forest and Wildlife Department, Revenue Department, Local Self Government Department and also Directors of Scheduled Tribes Development Department, The Principal Secretary, and KIRTADS. KILA Development Department is the Convenor of the Committee. It was also ordered to examine the subject by the Higher Level Committee and to submit recommendations. Subsequently the

But if the Grama Panchayath is taken as a unit it may be seen that there is 100% ST population in Idamalakkudi Grama Panchayath and Agali, Puthoor and Sholayur Grama Panchayaths in Attappady Block Palakkad District shows 35%, 62% and 61% of ST population respectively.

There are 23 Grama Panchayath and 3 Municipalities in

Wayanad District. 10 Panchayaths are having more than 20% of ST population and 2 of the above are having 40% of ST population. When examined, the geographic distribution of the colonies, they are seen scattered making it difficult to group them together, except the colonies in Noolpuzha and Thirunelli Grama Panchayaths. Therefore the Director, Scheduled Tribes Development Department has recommended to consider Wayanad District as a whole so as to notify it as a Scheduled Area considering the socio economic status of the area or to consider 3 Grama Panchayaths in the District with ST population above 30% as Scheduled Areas.

In Malappuram, 4 wards with 30% - 50% ST population and 1 ward with 88% ST population in Kannur, the ST colonies are scattered so that mapping together of these Colonies becomes difficult. Therefore it is recommend to consider these wards as separate Scheduled areas.

In the light of the facts stated above, as part of the implementation of PESA Act 1996 in Wayanad, Palakkadd, Idukki, Kannur and Malappuram Districts in Kerala, the following areas may be considered to be notified as Scheduled Areas. This may also be submitted before the Higher Level Committee for consideration.

(1) 13 Wards in Idamalakkudi Grama Panchayath in Idukki District may be considered as Scheduled Area on account of the 100% ST population in the area.

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- (2) Puthur, Sholayur and Agali Grama Panchayaths in Palakkad Districts may be considered as Scheduled Area.

- (4) 4 Wards in Malappuram District with 30% 50% ST population and one Ward with 88% ST population in Kannur District may be considered as Scheduled Area.



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PESA-Act=1996 - Note

The subject is the process of notifying selected areas in the State as 'Scheduled Areas' on the basis of the criteria defined as per Panchayath Extension of Scheduled Areas Act, 1996 (PESA Act '96). The purpose of implementing this Act in the State is the empowerment of the ST people. A High Level Committee was constituted vide GO(Ms)No.38/2017/SCSTDD dated 17-05-2017 for facilitating the implementation of PESA Act in the State. The Committee convened a meeting on 27-11-2017 and decided as follows:

- Prepare ward based list showing the number of Tribes and non-Tribal people residing in Wayanad, Palakkad, Idukki, Kannur and Malappuram Districts.
- Findout the Ward/Panchayath/Municipality with considerable ST population.
- Prepare list of Wards with ST reservation.
- Based on geographic distribution of the ST colonies, examine the possibilities of mapping together these colonies as to contiguous unit.

Accordingly, the Director, Scheduled Tribes Development Department has furnished the following proposal regarding the implementation of PESA Act '96 in the State.

(1) 13 Wards in Idamalakkudi Grama Panchayath in Idukki District may be considered as Scheduled Area on account of the 100% ST population in the area.

- Puthur, Sholayur and Agali Grama Panchayaths in Palakkad (2) Districts may be considered as Scheduled Area.
- On account of its socio-economic status, Wayanad District, as a (3) whole may be considered as Scheduled Area or 3 Grama Panchayaths with 30% ST population in the District may be considered.
- 4 Wards in Malappuram District with 30% 50% ST population and one Ward with 88% ST population in Kannur District may be considered as Scheduled Area.

The above proposal submitted by the Director, Scheduled Tribes Development Department regarding the implementation of PESA Act '96 is the subject for discussion in the meeting scheduled.

ORDER

- As per the letter read above the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of 1. India had requested to furnish details of Scheduled areas, total population and ST population as per 2011 Census and the names of districts, taluks/cites which are proposed to be declared as Scheduled Tribes areas under the 5th schedule of Indian Constitution.
- In Kerala, majority of tribal hamlets are located not contiguous or interconnected to each other and such hamlets have only limited inhabitants and limited land in possession. This may lead to many practical inconveniences in the matter of implementation of the Provisions of the Act.
- No detailed study has been conducted in the matter of feasibility of 3. inclusion of any particular hamlet and no hamlet in Southern Districts of the State starting from Ernakulam to Thiruvananthapuram, except Edamalakudi is seen included. Hence a general guideline has to be formed for the purpose of defining the areas of Grama Sabhas under the PESA Act as Scheduled areas so as to avoid any dispute on the inclusion or non-inclusion of any area under the Act.
- Government have examined the matter in detail and are pleased to issue orders to constitute a High Level Committee with the following members, for the formulation of general Guidelines for the purpose of defining the areas of Grama Sabha under the PESA Act as Scheduled areas.

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NOTE

The subject is the process of notifying selected areas in the State as 'Scheduled Areas' on the basis of the criteria defined as per Panchayath Extension of Scheduled Areas Act, 1996 (PESA Act '96). The purpose of implementing this Act in the State is the empowerment of the ST people. A High Level Committee was constituted vide GO(Ms)No.38/2017/SCSTDD dated 17-05-2017 for facilitating the implementation of PESA Act in the State. The Committee convened a meeting on 27-11-2017 and decided as follows:

- Prepare ward based list showing the number of Tribes and non-Tribal people residing in Wayanad, Palakkad, Idukki, Kannur and Malappuram Districts.
- Findout the Ward/Panchayath/Municipality with considerable ST population.
- · Prepare list of Wards with ST reservation.
- Based on geographic distribution of the ST colonies, examine the possibilities of mapping together these colonies as to contiguous unit.

Accordingly, the Director, Scheduled Tribes Development Department has furnished the following proposal regarding the implementation of PESA Act '96 in the State.

(1) 13 Wards in Idamalakkudi Grama Panchayath in Idukki District may be considered as Scheduled Area on account of the 100% ST population in the area.

- (2) Puthur, Sholayur and Agali Grama Panchayaths in Palakkad Districts may be considered as Scheduled Area.
- (3) On account of its socio-economic status, Wayanad District, as a whole may be considered as Scheduled Area or 3 Grama Panchayaths with 30% ST population in the District may be considered.
- (4) 4 Wards in Malappuram District with 30% 50% ST population and one Ward with 88% ST population in Kannur District may be considered as Scheduled Area.

The above proposal submitted by the Director, Scheduled Tribes Development Department regarding the implementation of PESA Act '96 is the subject for discussion in the meeting scheduled.

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ORDER

- As per the letter read above the Ministry of Tribal Affairs. Government of ١. India had requested to furnish details of Scheduled areas, total population and ST population as per 2011 Census and the names of districts, taluks/cites which are proposed to be declared as Scheduled Tribes areas under the 5th schedule of Indian Constitution.
- In Kerala, majority of tribal hamlets are located not contiguous or 2. interconnected to each other and such hamlets have only limited inhabitants and limited land in possession. This may lead to many practical inconveniences in the matter of implementation of the Provisions of the Act.
- No detailed study has been conducted in the matter of feasibility of 3. inclusion of any particular hamlet and no hamlet in Southern Districts of the State starting from Ernakulam to Thiruvananthapuram, except Edamalakudi is seen included. Hence a general guideline has to be formed for the purpose of defining the areas of Grama Sabhas under the PESA Act as Scheduled areas so as to avoid any dispute on the inclusion or non-inclusion of any area under the Act.
- Government have examined the matter in detail and are pleased to issue 4. orders to constitute a High Level Committee with the following members, for the formulation of general Guidelines for the purpose of defining the areas of Grama Sabha under the PESA Act as Scheduled areas.

Note for discussion in the High Level Committee Constituted for the formulation of general guidelines for the purpose of re-defying the criteria for declaring Scheduled Areas as per PESA ACT 1996.

Introduction

The provisions of Panchayats (Extension to Scheduled Areas) Act 1996 or PESA is a law enacted by the Government of India for ensuring self governance through traditional Grama Sabha for people living in the Scheduled Areas of India. The PESA Act gives radical governance powers to the tribal community and recognizes its traditional community rights over local natural resources. It accepts the validity of customary law, social and religious practices, and traditional management practices of community resources. Accepting a clear-cut role for the community, it gives wide-ranging powers to Grama Sabhas.

In Kerala, majority of tribal hamlets are located not contiguous or interconnected to each other and such hamlets have only limited inhabitants and limited land in possession. This may lead to many practical inconveniences in the matter of implementation of the Provisions of the Act.

Governments of Kerala vide G.O (MS)No.38/17/SCSTDD, dated 17/05/2017, had constituted a High Level Committee for the formulation of general guidelines for the purpose of defining the areas of Grama Sabha as Scheduled Areas under PESA Act. The Committee convened a meeting on 27/11/2017 and decided as follows.

- 1. Prepare ward base list showing the number of Tribes and non-Tribal people residing in Wayanad, Palakkad, Idukki, Kannur and Malappuram districts.
- 2. Find out the Ward/Panchayat/ Muncipality with considerable ST population.
- 3. Prepare list of wards with ST reservation.
- 4. Based on geographic distribution of ST colonies, examine the possibilities of mapping together these colonies as to contiguous unit.

Also the Ministry of Tribal Affairs (C & LM Division), Government of India, vide letter No. 18016/04/2017- C & LM, dated 01/01/2018, had informed that all revenue villages with 40% and more tribal population according to 1951. Census may be considered as Scheduled Area on merit. Since the criterion of preponderance of Tribal population presently followed for declaration of

Scheduled Areas needed move clarity, and hence it was requested to furnish views regarding the minimum percentage of tribal population in the concerned administrative unit, to render it eligible for declaration as Scheduled Areas.

The Department had furnished specific remarks for re-defining the 4 criteria for declaration of Scheduled Areas under 5th schedule of constitution as follows.

- (a). The State of Kerala was formed on 1st November 1956. Hence the percentage of Tribal population, according to 1951 census are not available. The tribal population according to 2011 census may be taken into account for the process of notifying selected areas as Scheduled Areas.
- (b). Scheduled Areas in Kerala doesn't exist. Hence the question of contiguity with Scheduled Areas is irrelevant at present.
- (c). The minimum constituent unit in Wayanadu, Attappady and Edamalakkudy may be Grama Panchayats and Panchayat ward may be in the case of Malappuram and Kannur districts.
- (d). All the proposed areas mentioned above are socially, economically and educationally backward, based on the socio-economic survey conducted and published during November 2013.

Based on the specific remarks furnished above Department has furnished the following proposal, according to 2011 census.

- *. 13 wards in Edamalakkudi Grama Panchayat in Idukki district may be considered as Scheduled Area on account of 100% ST population in the area. .
- *. Pudur, Sholayur and Agali Grama Panchayats in Palakkad districts may be considered as Scheduled Area.
- *. On account of its socio-economic status, Wayanadu district, as a whole may be considered as Scheduled Area or 3 Grama Panchayats with more than 30% ST population in the district may be considered.
- *. 4 wards in Malappuram district with 30%-50% ST population and one ward with 88% ST population in Kannur district may be considered as Scheduled Area.

Ward wise population of Tribes and non-tribal people residing in Wayanadu, Palakkad, Idukki, Kannur and Malappuram districts are attached separately.

BRIEF NOTE ON PESA ACT 1996

The provisions of Panchayath (Extension to Scheduled Areas) Act 1996 or PESA is a law enacted by the Government of India for ensuring self governance through traditional Grama Sabhas for people living in the Scheduled Areas of India. PESA was enacted on 24 December 1996 to extend the provisions of Part IX of the constitution to Scheduled Areas, with certain exceptions and modifications. PESA sought to enable the Panchayats at appropriate levels and Grama Sabhas to implement a system of self governance with respect to a number of issues such as customary resources, minor forest produce, minor minerals, minor water bodies, selection of beneficiaries, sanctions of projects and control over local institutions. PESA was viewed as a positive development for tribal communities in Scheduled Areas who had earlier suffered tremendously from engagement with modern development processes and from the operation of both colonial laws and statutes made in independent India. The loss of access to forest land, and other community resources had increased their vulnerability. Rampant land acquisition and displacement due to development projects had led to large scale distress in tribal communities living in Scheduled Areas. PESA was seen as a panacea for many of these vulnerabilities and sought to introduce a new paradigm of development where the tribal communities in such Scheduled Areas were to decide by themselves the pace and priorities of their development.

Salient Provisions of PESA ACT

In the Schedule Areas, every village will have a Tribal Grama Sabha (Oorukoottam).

In the Schedule areas there will be a minimum of 50% seats reservation of Scheduled Tribes.

The Chairpersons at all levels of the Panchayats in Scheduled areas shall be reserved for Scheduled Tribes.

Every legislation on the Panchayats in Scheduled Areas shall be in conformity with customary law, social and religious practices and traditional management practice of the community resources.

Powers and Authority of the GramaSabha and Panchayats in Scheduled Tribes.

- a. Grama Sabha has the power to safeguard and preserve the traditions and customs of people, their cultural identity, community resources and customary mode of dispute resolutions.
- b. It also has power to approve plans, programmes and projects for social and economic development, to identify persons as beneficiaries under the poverty alleviation and other programmes etc.
- c. The power to enforce prohibition or to regulate or restrict the sale and consumption of any intoxicant.
- d. The ownership of minor forest produces.
- e. The power to prevent alienation of land in Scheduled Areas and to take appropriate action to restore any unlawfully alienated land of a Scheduled Tribes.
- f. The power to manage village markets
- g. The power to exercise control over money lending to the Scheduled Tribes.
- h. The power to control over institutions and functionaries in all social sectors.
- i. The power to control over local plans and resources for such plans including tribal sub-plans.

Fifth Schedule

The fifth Scheduled under Article 244(1) of constitution defines "Scheduled" Areas" as such areas as the President may by order declare to be scheduled areas after consultation with the Governor of that State.

The criteria for declaring any area as a "Scheduled Area" under the Fifth Schedule are:

- 1. Preponderance of tribal population
- 2. Compactness and reasonable size of the area.
- 3. A viable administrative entity such as a district, block or taluk
- 4. Economic backwardness of the area as compared to neighboring areas.

The specification of "Scheduled Area" in relation to a State is by a notified Order of President of India, after consultation with State Government concerned. The same applies for altering increasing, decreasing, incorporating new areas, or rescinding any orders relating to "Scheduled Area".

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF PESA

Colonial rule in India produced several new policies that had deleterious consequences for the indigenous population of the country. In the broadest sense, the British approached the jungles with an overarching goal of bringing 'primitive' peoples under the control of a modern, centralized bureaucracy.

Another major change dealt with forest policies and tribal land displacement. Colonial rule marked the first time in Indian history that a government claimed a direct proprietary right over forests. The British state became the conservator of forests when it passed the Indian Forest Act of 1878. Hundreds of thousands of acres of forest lands that adivasis had used unfettered for centuries were suddenly kept in reserve, a practice that did not change for the rest of the colonial period. With British control of the forests came the concomitant rise of moneylenders, traders, and immigrants, and the influx of these new intermediary groups led to widespread adivasi land displacement.

Consequently, revolts among the indigenous population became a routine occurrence during colonialism, especially in the nineteenth century. Colonial administrators, however, only directly governed three-quarters of the population of India; the remainder lived in semi-autonomous princely states. These areas did not experience nearly the same level of tribal discontent or conflict. Despite having a reputation as feudal autocrats, many princes pursued liberal policies towards the same tribal groups that rebelled in British India. In Travancore and Cochin, tribal groups were given ownership of their land, government subsidies to improve it, and were shielded by special policies that limited the imposition of the outsiders who were a major problem for adivasis throughout British India

Confronted with struggles and revolts, the British introduced several protective measures for the tribal areas in the hill tracts and started the process of identifying the tribal communities. In 1874, the Scheduled Districts Act XIV (Central Act) was passed, under which, Scheduled Districts were defined to mean the territory mentioned in the First Schedule and Parts thereof and would include any other territory to which the Secretary of State for India by resolution in Council may declare. The provincial Government issued rules prescribing the procedure to be followed by the officers appointed there under to administer Agency Tracts. Bihar, for instance had a substantial tribal population largely located in its plateau region (now Jharkhand state). The colonial administration brought in the Wilkinson

Rifles 1839, the Chotanagpur Tenancy Act, 1869 and the Santal Parganas Act, 1855, creating a legal frame work for the protection of the land belonging to tribes following recurrent rebellions in the tribal area. The Regulation I of 1796 laid down the foundations of the preset Santhal Policy, which continues to this date without much alteration. Such protectionary legislation existed in other states as well such as the States of Assam including what was then called the North East, Central India and tribal areas of the Bombay and Madras Presidencies.

The Montague-Chelmsford Reforms (1918) considered the tribal question and excluded them from the Provincial Governments. The Government of India Act, 1919 categorized the excluded territories into two parts, the wholly and the partially excluded. The wholly excluded areas were small while the latter were more extensive and were entrusted to the joint responsibility of the Governor and the Governor-General-in-Council. The Montague-Chelmosford Reforms had suggested that the areas inhabited by the Primitive Tribe Groups should be excluded from the proposed political reforms and should be administered by the Governor of the Province. The tribal issue also attracted the attention of the Indian Statutory Commission (Simon Commission), which considered the inhabitants of their areas being politically not "advanced". They required security of land tenure, protection from subjugation and freedom to pursue their traditional livelihood and customs. The Simon Commission felt that the duty of educating these people could not be left to the missionaries or the individual officials. The Government should earmark funds for such educational and welfare activities. The Commission suggested the whole or partial exclusion of these areas form the ambit of generally administered areas in recognition of these Principles. The Government of India Act, 1935, treated the Scheduled Districts as wholly or partially excluded. A notification to this effect was issued Under Sections 91 of the Government of India Act, 1935. Under Sections 92(1) & (2) of this Act, the administration of these areas was exclusively vested into the Governor of the Province.

Thus colonial government considered the traditional rules and practices of tribal people and provided them with concessional rights, and recognized the autonomy of Tribal Council. Later post independence fathers of Constitution upheld the Tribal Areas as V th and VI th Schedule. These are the history of tribal self-rule during in the Colonial period.

Post Independence

The Constitutional assembly has given much attention to tribal people to protect the tribal culture, customary law, traditional management practices of community resources by ensuring constitutional safeguards such as political, administrative, social and educational. Moreover, constitution upheld the tribal self-rule in the colonial period as V th and VI th Schedule. Thus, various Committees are appointed to review and improvement of conditions, personnel policy, land alienation, development programmes etc. of Tribal Areas. Following are committees appointed on Tribal Areas.

AV Thakkar was a first committee after independence on determining the areas to be classified as excluded or partially excluded. The committee was submitted its report on August 18, 1947 and the report suggested areas to be excluded and partially excluded in various states. Eg. Lakshdeep Islands, Chittagong Hill tracts (Bengal), Spiti and Lahoul in the Kangra district (Punjab) are excluded areas. The committee also had suggested Tribal Advisory Council, Central Commission, Tribal Minister, Tribal Panchayats etc.

Dhebar commission (1961) on Sch. Areas was appointed to report viz; administration of sch. Areas, functioning of tribal advisory Councils, the laws applicable to, principles to be followed in declaring any territory to be, or to form part of etc. The commission has recommended various aspects particularly criteria for determining Sch. Area under the objective of Fifth Schedule that to ensure protection of the Sch. Tribes and to raise the level of administration in the Sch. Areas.

L P Vidyarthi Committee (1972)

- L P Vidyarthi Committee has suggested that Tribal Areas may be categorized as: (a) extremely backward on the basis of the following criteria:
 - (i) Density of tribal population in relation to arable land;
 - (ii) Position of literacy (less than 5% or less than 50% literacy of the district/ State average);
 - (iii) Arable land, forest resources, irrigation facilities, etc.
 - (iv) Availability of agricultural infrastructure-land reforms, committee (1978) and
 - (v) Dévelopment of infrastructure.

R.N.Haldipur Commitee (1972)

Planning commission has constituted a Task Force on Development of Tribal Areas, under the chairmanship of Dr. R.N. Haldipur, with following objectives;

- 951
- (i) To review the nature and level of development, identify the present bottlenecks and weaknesses in policies and programmes and suggest corrective measures;
- (ii) To suggest a perspective of development from 1973-74 to 1988-89 in the light of the Ooverall development perspective envisaged in the Fourth Plan; and
- (iii) To formulate proposals for the Fifth Plan in the light of the perspective indicating priorities, policies, programmes and outlays.

The committee has divided tribal areas into four categories, (i) States and Union Territories have Tribal Majority, (ii) States have large concentrations of tribal population, (iii) States have substantial tribal population but are in a small minority, (iv) States have scattered tribal population. Tamil Nadu, Kerala and West Bengal are in fourth category. The Committee also has recommended that to review present position and monetary incentives, appointment in the lower category from local communities, as far as possible, qualifications of recruitment, training etc.

These are the important committees and commissions appointed in various times related to the implementation and development of Tribal Areas. The committees have felt that the target with goal of assimilation or integration of tribal communities in to the State ensuring self governing territories or administration. These got incorporated in the Constitution under Article 244 as Fifth and Sixth Scheduled Areas.

FIFTH SCHEDULE [Article 244 (1)]

Provisions as to the Administration and Control of Scheduled Areas and Scheduled Tribes PART C

SCHEDULED AREAS

- 6. Scheduled Areas: (1) in this constitution, the expression "Scheduled Areas" means such areas as the President may by order declare to be Scheduled Areas.
- (2) the president may at any time by order-
 - (a) direct that the whole or any specified part of a Scheduled Areas shall cease to be a Scheduled Area or a part of such an area;
 - (a a) increase the area of any Scheduled Area in a State after consultation with the Governor of that State;
 - (b) alter, but only by way of rectification of boundaries, any Scheduled Area;

- (c) on any alteration of the boundaries of a State or on the admission into the Union or the establishment of a new State, declare any territory not previously included in any State to be, or to form part of, a Scheduled Area;
- (d) rescind, in relation to any State or States, any order or orders made under this paragraph, and in consultation with the Governor of the State concerned, make fresh orders redifning the areas which are to be Scheduled Areas;

Tribal Advisory Council (TAC)

The fifth Schedule defines Scheduled Areas as areas notified as such by the President of India. TAC was to be constituted in all Scheduled Areas to advice the concerned Governors. As per Para 4(1) of the fifth Schedule of the Constitution, there shall be TAC in each state having Scheduled Areas therein and, if the President should directs, also in any State having Scheduled Tribes but non-Scheduled Areas therein.

The role of TAC is to advice on such matters pertaining to the welfare and advancement of the Scheduled Tribes in the State as may be referred to them by the Governor. No regulation shall be made unless the Governor making the regulation has, in the case where three is a TAC for the State, consulted such council.

UN Charter

India is one among 148 signatory countries that ensured protection of indigenous peoples under the UN Charter Article 4 and 5 in 2007 as follows in table.

United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples

Article 4

Indigenous peoples, in exercising their right to self-determination, have the right to autonomy or self government in matters relating to their internal local affairs, as well as ways and means for financing their autonomous functions.

Article 5

Indigenous peoples have the right to maintain and strengthen their distinct political, legal, economic, social, and cultural institutions, while retaining their right to participate fully, if they so choose, in the political, economic, social and cultural life of the State.



As per reference cited above, the comments of this department are as follows. The historical background of PESA is also attached as annexure -1

Identification of Habitats

After independence states were formed on the basis of language in all over India. The observation and studies reveals on formation of States on language that pushed away the dialect and culture of tribal people and have became marginalized in the area of education, development and administration. Instead of that there was a possibility to form as Tribal States in geographically to protect the culture and development of tribal people. Later tribal states are formed in Chhattisgarh and Jarkhand. In Kerala Westernghat region was ideal to form a Tribal Area Autonomous District Council. Unfortunately neither declared Scheduled Areas under 5th schedule in Kerala. In this historical juncture for declaration of Scheduled Areas and implementation of PESA is vital and which will help the tribal development in the different administrative practice.

The Constitution does not provide a definition of what should be the unit of area to be included under Scheduled Area. It was entirely political and administrative decision. In Practice, an area with a majority of Scheduled Tribes or with substantial Scheduled Tribe population with the unit of area being a Revenue Village, Panchayath, Block or District. However with the enactment of PESA, the unit of governance came to be the village defined as' habitation or a group of habitations or a hamlet or a group of hamlets' [Se.4 (b) of PESA], which was subsequently adopted in FRA [Sec.2(p)].

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In this context this department is furnishing specific remarks for declaration of Schedule Areas as follows;

- (a) Tribal population according to 1961 or 1971 census may taken into account for the process of notifying selected areas as Scheduled Areas if not available the percentage of tribal population in 1951 census. Moreover, consultation shall be made with Oorukoottoms or with Adivasi Organisations in selecting the Area or Westernghats region (in Kerala) may be declared as Schedule Area. Topdown approach should be reversed with the bottom-up approach.
- (b) Scheduled Area has to be at least coterminous. The habitations should be grouped appropriately to being separate compact district or even where the area is no contiguous; it can still be a district, just as the Tripura Tribal Area Autonomous District Council.
- (c) Wayanadu as whole area, except new formed Municipalities like Sulthan Bathery and Mananthawady and Kalpetta (PESA is applicable only Panchayath and not for Municipal Area) may be declared under Schedule Area, (in 1951or 1961the preponderance of the population of the region was tribal people explicitly), on account of its socio-economic status, low literacy rate and backwardness of area. Besides Nelliyampathy Panchayath and Parambikulam area in Palakkad district; Malayan settlements in Chimmoney Wildlife Sanctuary in Varandirapiily Panchayath and Kadar settlements in Athirappilly Panchayath of Thrissur district; Malai Pandaram settlements in Pathanamthitta district and Kani settlements in Thiruvanthapuram districts may be declared under Schedule Area.
- (d) The socio-economic survey conducted by KILA in 2008 can be also utilized to determine the proposed Sch. Area.

(e) This department fully agrees with the proposal of 13 wards in Edamalakudy Grama Panchayath (Idukki) with 100% ST population, Pudur, Sholayur and Agali Grama Panchayaths in Palakkad district and 4 wards in Malappuram district with 30-50 percentages ST population and one ward with 88% ST population in Kannur district, to be declared as Sch. Area.


From the socio-economic survey conducted by KILA in 2008, 2391 Ooru has been proposed to be included in the PESA. However in due course similar backward habitats can be selected and included under PESA in phased manner.

- As per the letter read above the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of 1. India had requested to furnish details of Scheduled areas, total population and ST population as per 2011 Census and the names of districts, taluks/cites which are proposed to be declared as Scheduled Tribes areas under the 5th schedule of Indian Constitution.
- In Kerala, majority of tribal hamlets are located not contiguous or 2. interconnected to each other and such hamlets have only limited inhabitants and limited land in possession. This may lead to many practical inconveniences in the matter of implementation of the Provisions of the Act.
- No detailed study has been conducted in the matter of feasibility of 3. inclusion of any particular hamlet and no hamlet in Southern Districts of the State starting from Ernakulam to Thiruvananthapuram, except Edamalakudi is seen included. Hence a general guideline has to be formed for the purpose of defining the areas of Grama Sabhas under the PESA Act as Scheduled areas so as to avoid any dispute on the inclusion or non-inclusion of any area under the Act.
- Government have examined the matter in detail and are pleased to issue 4. orders to constitute a High Level Committee with the following members, for the formulation of general Guidelines for the purpose of defining the areas of Grama Sabha under the PESA Act as Scheduled areas.

Member 1. Additional Chief Secretary, Forest Department

Member 2. Additional Chief Secretary, Revenue Department

3. Principal Secretary, Local Self Government Department- ... Member 4. Director, Scheduled Tribes Development Department -Member 5. Director, KILA Member 6. Director, KIRTADS Member 7. Principal Secretary, SC/ST Department

The Committee shall furnish report to Government within 3 months.

Subject: - STDD - Implementation of PESA Act 1996 -Reg.

Note for Circulation

This file deals with the process of notifying selected areas in the State as 'Scheduled Areas' on the basis of the criteria defined as per Panchayath Extension of Scheduled Areas Act, 1996 (PESA Act '96). The purpose of implementing this Act in the State is the empowerment of the ST people. This Act ensure special powers to the Grama Sabha of the Scheduled Area in the matters like Liquor ban, Minor Forest Produce, Prevention of the transfer of Land owned by the Scheduled Tribes, control of the local markets and financial institutions in the area etc.

It may be seen that in order to implement the Act, the densely ST populated areas need to be notified as 'Schedules Areas'. Criteria for notifying a particular area as Scheduled Area are as follows:

- 1. Considerable population of Scheduled Tribes
- 2. Convenience and suitability for Local self governance (as Taluk, Panchayath, Village, Block etc.
- 3. Developmental backwardness of the area.
- 4. Economically backward condition compared to the adjacent areas.

As per GO(Ms)No.38/2017/SCSTDD dated 17-05-2017, a High Level Committee was constituted with the Secretaries in SC ST Development Department, Forest and Wildlife Department, Revenue Department, Local Self Government Department and also Directors of Scheduled Tribes Development Department, KILA and KIRTADS. The Principal Secretary, SC/ST Development Department is the Convenor of the Committee.

In the meeting of the Higher Level Committee convened on 25-04 2019, the Director, STDD was asked to furnish a note on the implementation of the above Act and also to seek opinion of the stake holding departments on the above report. Note submitted by the Director, STDD as directed by the Committee may be seen.

The remarks of the Director, ST Development Department regarding the criteria for declaration of Scheduled Areas are as follows:

- (a) The State of Kerala was formed on 1st November 1956. Hence the percentage of Tribal population, according to 1951 census are not available. The tribal population according to 2011 census may be taken into account for the process of notifying selected areas as Scheduled Areas.
- (b) Scheduled Areas in Kerala doesn't exist. Hence the question of contiguity with Scheduled Areas is irrelevant at present.
- (c) The minimum constituent unit in Wayanadu, Attappady and Edamalakkudy may be Grama Panchayats and Panchayat ward may be in the case of Malappuram and Kannur districts.
- (d) All the proposed areas mentioned above are socially, economically and educationally backward, based on the socio-economic survey conducted and published during November 2013.

In connection with the notification of Scheduled Area in the State, the Director, STDD has suggested as follows:

- 13 wards in Edamalakkudi Grama Panchayat in Idukki district may be considered as Scheduled Area on account of 100% ST population in the area.
- Pudur, Sholayur and Agali Grama Panchayats in Palakkad districts may be considered as Scheduled Area.
- On account of its socio-economic status, Wayanadu district, as a whole may be considered as Scheduled Area or 3 Grama

Panchayats with more than 30% ST population in the district may be considered.

• 4 wards in Malappuram district with 30%-50% ST population and one ward with 88% ST population in Kannur district may be considered as Scheduled Area.

The Director has submitted the Ward wise population of Tribes and non-tribal people residing in Wayanadu, Palakkad, Idukki, Kannur and Malappuram districts.

Revenue, LSG Departments and the Directors of KILA and KIRTADS have furnished their remarks as decided in the meeting of the HLC.

KILA

The KILA has agreed with the criteria for declaration of 'Schedule Area' They have also endorsed the proposal of the ST Development department except in the case of Wayanad District. In the case of Wayanad, the district as a whole need to be considered as Schedule Area.

KIRTADS

KIRTADS offered the following remarks:

- (a) Tribal population according to 1961 or 1971 census may taken into account for the process of notifying selected areas as Scheduled Areas if not available the percentage of Tribal population in 1951 census. Moreover, consultation shall be made with Oorukoottoms or with Adivasi Organisations in selecting the Area or Westernghats region (1n Kerala) may be declared as Schedule Area. Top-down approach should be reversed with the bottom-up approach.
- (c) Wayanad as a whole area except new formed Municipalities like Sulthan Bathery and Mananthawady and Kalpetta (PESA is applicable only in Panchayath and Municipality area) may be declared under Scheduled Area (in 1951 or 1961 the preponderance of the population of the region was Tribal people explicitly), on account of its socio-economic status, low literacy

state and backwardness of the area. Besides Nelliyampathy Panchayath and Parambaikkulam area in Palakkad District: Malayan settlements in Chimmoney Wildlife sanctuary in Varanthirapily Panchayath and Kadar settlements in Athirappilly Panchayath of Thrissur District; Malai Pandaram settlements in Pathanamthitta District and Kani settlements in Thiruvananthapuram District may be declared under Scheduled Area.

- (b) Scheduled Area has to be at least coterminous. The habitations should be grouped appropriately to being separate compact district or even where the area is no contiguous; it can still be a district, just as the Tripura Tribal Area Autonomous District Council.
- (d) The socio-economic survey conducted by KILA in 2008 can be also utilized to determine the proposed Sch. Area.
- (e) The department fully agrees with the proposal of 13 wards in Edamalakudy Grama Panchayath (Idukki) with 100% ST population, Pudur, Sholayur and Agali Grama Panchayaths in Palakkad district and 4 wards in Malappuram district with 30-50 percentages ST population and one ward with 88% ST population in Kannur district, to be declared as Sch. Area.

From the socio-economic survey conducted by KILA in 2008, 2391 Ooru has been proposed to be included in the PESA. However in due course similar backward habitats can be selected and included under PESA in phased manner.

Revenue Department

Since the Tribal population in Kerala is residing scattered within a revenue village, re-defining the criteria for notifying 'Scheduled Area' as per the guidelines prescribed by the Government of India may be accepted in accordance with the report submitted by the Director, STDD.

Local Self Government Department

The Department opined that the PESA Act can only be implemented in States were the 'Scheduled Area' as per the

provisions of the PESA Act 1996 exists. Since no such 'Scheduled Area' has been notified in the State of Kerala, it is not possible to implement the above Act at present.

Forest and Wildlife Department

Report from the F&WL, Department is yet to be received.

It may be seen that in order to implement the Act, the ST populated areas has to be notified as 'Schedules Areas'. The remarks/suggestions of the departments concerned on the note submitted by the Director, STDD regarding the implementation of the PESA Act has been received. Therefore a meeting of the High Level Committee may be convened to decide the matter.

File may be circulated to the Hon'ble Minister for the Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes for orders.
