REPORT

This Report deals with the Action Taken by Government on the recommendations contained in the 87th Report of the Committee on Public Undertakings (2019-21) relating to Kerala State Mineral Development Corporation Limited based on the Report of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India for the year ended 31st March 2014 and 2015.

The Eighty Seventh Report of the Committee on Public Undertakings (2019-21) was presented in the House on 18th June 2019. The Report contain six recommendations and the statement of action taken furnished by Government on all these recommendations.

The Committee examined the Statement of Action Taken on the Recommendations contained in the 87th Report of the Committee in the meeting held on 07.05.2024 and decided not to pursue further action on the replies furnished by the Government. These Recommendations, Statement of Action Taken furnished by the Government form this Report.

Discussion of the Committee

The Committee considered the Statement of Action Taken on the recommendations in its meeting held on 07.05.2024 and enquired about the payment of Rs. 1.09 Crore to the Head Load Workers as Nokkukooli. The witness replied that during the mechanized de-silting activity of Malampuzha, Chulliyar and Walayar interrupted the Cabinet Dams. work was due to local issues and the Sub-Committee intervened and the related works were done by local workers. The Government had accorded sanction to spend Rs. 3 crore per year towards wages to 316 registered union labourers of Malampuzha, Chulliyar and Walayar, accordingly Company paid ₹ 1.09 crore for actual work done by 316 labourers who were engaged in the work up to October 2010 and further informed that KEMDEL has not paid Nokkukooli to the Head Load Workers. Based on the explanation given by the concerned officials, the Committee accepted the Statement of Action Taken on the Recommendation and decided that the word 'Nokkukooli' mentioned in the Original Report ceases to exist.
