### **Adjournment Motion**

During the session 25 notices of Adjournment Motion were received. Out of which one was taken up for discussion, the details of which is given below. The remaining 24 notices were not admitted during the session.

On July 9, 2014, the Speaker informed the House that Shri S. Sarma and three other members had given notice for moving of an adjournment motion regarding the serious situation that has arisen consequent on the total neglect to the State in the Railway Budget and reported failure of State Government to bring in the demands to the notice of the Union Government. As the Chief Minister expressed the readiness of the Government to discuss the matter, the Speaker informed that the motion would be taken up for discussion after the discussion on Finance Bills and two hours time would be allotted for the same. Shri S. Sarma moved the adjournment motion at the allotted time and a discussion was held. Shri Aryadan Muhammed, Minister for Power and Shri Oommen Chandy, Chief Minister replies to the points raised in the discussion. The motion was then withdrawn by the leave of the house.

On June 12, 2014, the Speaker announced that the examination of the documents laid on the Table in connection with the statement made by the Chief Minister regarding the answer to starred question No. 63 of 11-6-2014 raised by Smt. Jameela Prakasam has been referred to Subject Committee III—Water Resource and Smt. Jameela Prakasam would be Special Invitee to the Committee (The Chief Minister laid on the Table the papers regarding the matter).

On July 1, 2014, the Speaker gave ruling regarding the time bound laying of annual reports and statements of Boards, Constitutional Bodies and Public Undertakings in the State on the point of order raised by Shri M. Ummer.

On July 11, 2014, the Speaker gave ruling on a point of order raised by Shri Kodiyceri Balakrishnan with respect to Rule 70 (4) regarding the motion for leave to introduce Private Members' Bills.

On July 15, 2014, the Speaker gave ruling that when Finance Bills are referred for joint consideration with different Subject Committees, members who records their notes of dissent to the Reports except the members of Subject Committee VIII Economic Affairs may do so only on those subjects represented by the respective Committees.

“119 കൊല്ലം പഴക്കമുള്ള മുല്ലപ്പെരിയാർ അണക്കെട്ടിന്റെ സുരക്ഷ സംബന്ധിച്ച് കേരള ജനതയ്ക്കുള്ള ആശങ്ക ഇന്നും നിലനില്ക്കുന്നു. കേരളത്തിലെ ജനങ്ങൾക്ക് സുരക്ഷയും തമിഴ്നാടിന് വെള്ളവും ലഭ്യമാക്കുന്നതിന് ഒരു പുതിയ ഡാം നിർമ്മിക്കുക എന്നതാണ് ആത്യന്തികമായ പരിഹാരം. 1979-ൽ കേന്ദ്ര ജല കമ്മീഷൻ നിർദ്ദേശിച്ച തന്തുസരിച്ച് പുതിയ ഡാമിനുവേണ്ടി കേരളവും തമിഴ്നാടും യോജിച്ച് സ്ഥലം കണ്ടെത്തുകയുണ്ടായി. പുതിയ ഡാം നിർമ്മിക്കുന്നതു സംബന്ധിച്ച് ഇരു സംസ്ഥാനങ്ങളും തമ്മിൽ ധാരണയുണ്ടാക്കുവാൻ കേന്ദ്ര ഗവൺമെന്റ് മദ്ധ്യസ്ഥം വഹിക്കണമെന്ന് ഈ സഭ എകകണ്ഠമായി അഭ്യർത്ഥിക്കുന്നു.

മുല്ലപ്പെരിയാർ ഡാമിലെ ജലനിരപ്പ് ഉയർത്തിയാൽ സമീപ പ്രദേശത്തെ വനങ്ങളുടേയും വന്യജീവികളുടേയും അപൂർവ്വ സസ്യജാലങ്ങളുടേയും നാശത്തിന് കാരണമാകും. നിലവിലുള്ള വനം, വന്യജീവി, പരിസ്ഥിതി സംരക്ഷണ നിയമങ്ങൾ കർശനമായി പാലിക്കപ്പെടുന്നു എന്ന് ഉറപ്പ് വരുത്തുവാൻ കേന്ദ്ര സർക്കാർ നടപടികൾ സ്വീകരിക്കണമെന്ന് ഈ സഭ അഭ്യർത്ഥിക്കുന്നു.

അതോടൊപ്പം മുല്ലപ്പെരിയാർ ഡാമിന്റെ താഴെ വസിക്കുന്ന നാൽപ്പത് ലക്ഷത്തോളം ജനങ്ങളുടെ ജീവനും സ്വത്തിനും ഉണ്ടാകാവുന്ന വിപത്തും ഇതുണ്ടാക്കുന്ന ഗുരുതരമായ സ്ഥിതിവിശേഷവും പരിഗണിച്ച് ഈ വിഷയം ഭരണഘടനയുടെ 143-ാം അനുച്ഛേദം അനുസരിച്ച് ബഹു. രാഷ്ട്രപതി സുപ്രീം കോടതിക്ക് റഫർ ചെയ്യണമെന്ന് ഈ സഭ ഏകകണ്ഠമായി അഭ്യർത്ഥിക്കുന്നു”.

The Substantive motion was unanimously adopted by the House.

On July 2, 2014, Shri C. Divakaran moved the following motion under Rule 130 and spoke.

Shri K. P. Mohanan, Minister for Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Printing and Stationery replied to the points raised in the discussion.

In clause 3 (2) after the sub clause (c) a new sub clause (d) shall be added:---

In clause 10 (1) for the word “ninety”, the words “one hundred and twenty” shall be substituted.

### **Financial Business**

#### (1) *Budget for 2014-2015*

13 days were allotted for the discussion on Demands for Grants in the Budget for the Financial Year 2014-2015, during the Eleventh Session.

Out of 2216 cut motions received, 2049 were moved and disposed off. There were 234 occasions for speech including reply by the Ministers in connection with the discussion and voting on Demands for Grants.

The Assembly devoted 62 hours and 22 minutes for transacting financial business relating to the Budget for 2014-2015. The details are given in Appendix IX and X.

The Appropriation (No. 14) Bill, 2014, in respect of the Budget for the year 2014-2015 was introduced by the Minister for Finance Law and Housing, on 10-7-2014. The Bills were taken up for consideration and passed on the same day. The house devoted 2 hours and 56 minutes for the business.

#### (2) *Supplementary Demands for Grants*

On 16th July 2014, the Minister for Finance, Law and Housing laid before the House the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2014-2015.

The Discussion and voting on the Supplementary Demands For Grants took place on 16th July, 2014 and the House devoted 4 hours for the transaction of the business.

The Kerala Appropriation (No. 15) Bill, 2014, in respect of the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2014-2015 was introduced in the Assembly on 17th July, 2014. The Bill was taken into consideration and passed on the same day. The house devoted 1 hour and 9 minutes for the business.

### **Private Members' Business**

According to the calendar of sittings of the Eleventh Session of the Thirteenth Kerala Legislative Assembly, five days were allotted for transacting Private Members' Business viz. 13th, 20th and 27th of June and 4th and 11th of July, 2014. Though five days were set apart for transacting Private Members' Business, the House transacted Private Members' Business only for 4 days i.e. on 13-6-2014, 20-6-2014, 27-6-2014 and 11-7-2014. During the Session, the House devoted 3 hours and 57 minutes in toto for Private Members' Business.

### **Private Members' Bills**

During the Session, the Business on Private Members Bills was transacted in three days, i.e. on the 13th and 27th of June and 11th of July, 2014. On the first day, i.e. on the 13th of June, 2014, motions for leave to introduce 24 Bills and the continuation of discussion on motions for leave to introduce 3 Bills were listed in the business. Motions for leave to introduce 10 Bills came up before the House. Out of these one Bill was withdrawn by the member considering the assurance given by the Minister. Motion for leave to introduce the remaining Bills were not taken up due to lack of time.

Considering the recommendations of the PMBR committee in its 19th Report, the Hon'ble Speaker restricted the number of motions for leave to introduce Private Members Bills on Fridays set apart for that business to five. As per the directions of the Hon'ble Speaker, on the 27th of June, 2014, the second day, scheduled for transacting Private Members' Bills motions for leave to introduce 5 Bills and the continuation of discussion on motions for leave to introduce 3 pending Bills only were listed in the business. Motions for leave to introduce 1 Bill and the continuation of discussion on motion for leave to introduce 2 Bills came up before the House. Out of these the first one was set apart for continuing the discussion and the latter two Bills were withdrawn by the members considering the assurances given by the Ministers concerned.

On 11th July, 2014, being, the third day scheduled for transacting Private Members' Bills, motions for leave to introduce 5 bills and the motion for continuation of discussion on motion for leave to introduce 3 pending bills were listed in the business. Out of these, motions for leave to introduce 5 Bills came up before the House. But the discussion on 3 pending Bills were not held due to lack of time.
