RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE FIFTEENTH SESSION OF THE THIRTEENTH KERALA LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

The summons dated November 13, 2015 for the Fifteenth Session of the Thirteenth Kerala Legislative Assembly was issued to the Members on November 16, 2015. The Session commenced at 8.30 a.m. on Monday, November 30, 2015 and adjourned *sine-die* at 11.47 p.m on Thursday, December 17, 2015. The House met on the following days viz., November 30, December 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 14, 15, 16, 17 (11 days of sittings). The House transacted business for 82 hours and 02 minutes (Appendix XII).

Obituary Reference

On November 30, 2015, the Speaker made reference on the demise of P. G. Purushothaman Pillai, N. P. Moideen and K. Somasekharan Nair, former members of Kerala Legislative Assembly. As a mark of respect to the deceased, the members stood in silence for a while.

Election of Deputy Speaker

On December 2, 2015, the Speaker informed the House that two Members viz. Shri Palode Ravi and Shri E. Chandrasekharan had been duly nominated as candidates for election as Deputy Speaker. Election was then conducted. All together 139 Members including the Speaker cast their votes. Shri Palode Ravi secured 74 votes and Shri E. Chandrasekharan secured 65 votes. Shri Palode Ravi was declared elected as Deputy Speaker.

Statement under Rule 64

On December 4, 2015, Shri K. M. Mani made a statement regarding his resignation from the Office of the Minister for Finance, Law and Housing.

Statement under Rule 300

On December 7, 2015, Minister for Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes and Tourism made a statement regarding the project 'Avarkkai Namukku Vangam', being implemented in the ninth season of the G.K.S.F. organized by Tourism department.

Statutory Resolution

On December 16, 2015, the following resolution under the proviso to sub-section (1) of section 3A of the Kerala Cashew Factories (Acquisition) Act, 1974 (Act 29 of 1974) moved by Shri P. K. Kunhalikutty, Minister for Industries and Information Technology was adopted by the House without discussion.

“WHEREAS, section 3A of the Kerala Cashew Factories (Acquisition) Act, 1974 empowers the Government to declare that the cashew factory shall stand transferred to and vested in Government, by an order published in the Gazette, if the Government are satisfied in relation to a cashew factory, that it has been closed for a period of not less than three months prior to the date of coming into force of the Kerala Cashew Factories (Acquisition) Amendment Act, 2015 (13 of 2015) or any day thereafter; and such closure has prejudicially affected the interest of the majority of the workers engaged in that factory and that immediate action is necessary to restart the cashew factory and such restarting is necessary in the public interest;

AND WHEREAS, as per the proviso to sub-section (1) of section 3A of the Kerala Cashew Factories (Acquisition) Act, 1974 (29 of 1974), no order under this sub-section shall be published unless the proposal for such acquisition is supported by a resolution of the Legislative Assembly which shall be passed within a period of six months from the date of publication of the order under sub-section (1) of the section;

AND WHEREAS, as per order issued under G.O. (P) No. 110/2015/ID dated 6th August, 2015 and published in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1842 dated 6th August, 2015 as S.R.O. No. 501/2015 dated 6th August, 2015, it has been declared that, in the interest of the public the Cashew Factories mentioned in schedule I to the said order, shall stand transferred and vest in the Government with effect from the date noted against each;

NOW, THEREFORE, the House hereby resolves to pass a resolution of the Legislative Assembly in view of the proviso to sub-section (1) of section 3A of the Kerala Cashew Factories (Acquisition) Act, 1974 (29 of 1974).”

Motion Under Rule 130

On December 2, 2015, Shri Kodiyeri Balakrishnan moved the following motion under Rule 130 and spoke:

Shri Ramesh Chennithala, Minister for Home and Vigilance, Smt. P. K. Jayalakshmi, Minister for Welfare of Scheduled Tribe, Youth Affairs, Museums & Zoos, Shri A. P. Anil Kumar, Minister for Welfare of Scheduled & Backward Classes and Tourism and Shri Oommen Chandy, Chief Minister replied to the points raised in the discussion.
