REPORT

This report deals with the action taken by Government on the recommendations contained in the Sixty Seventh Report of Committee on Public Undertakings (2004-2006). The Sixty Seventh Report relating to United Electrical Industries Limited based on the Report of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India for the year ended 31-3-1998 (Commercial) was presented to the House on 22nd July, 2004.

The Report contained 3 recommendations. Government have furnished replies to all the recommendations. The Committee (2004-2006) considered the replies received from Government at its meeting held on 9-11-2005.

The Committee accepted the replies to recommendations No. 1(7) and 2(8) without any remarks. These recommendations and their replies form Chapter I of the Report.

The reply to recommendation No. 3(9) was accepted by the Committee with remarks. This recommendation, its reply and the remarks of the Committee form Chapter II of the Report.

1.	7	Industries	The Committee deprecates the action of the Company in keeping huge amounts in the current account against short term deposits. The Committee observes that the company retained Rs.36 lakks throughout the year after meeting all the expenses. The surplus amount could have been deposited for at least 15 or 30 days as term deposits. This shows the financial indiscipline prevailing in the Company. The Committee, therefore, recommends that financial management of the Company should be made more systematic and effective. The Committee also suggests that stringent measures should be taken to avoid such lapses in future.	Now the Company is depositing excess funds in short term deposits so that the company can get interest and at the same time meet its working capital requirements. The Company is closely monitoring the fund requirement in relation to the orders anticipated and the investment will be properly made so that the Company doesn't lose interest.

existence. The Company has not chalked out any other specific programme to expand its customer base so far. The Committee, therefore, recommends that earnest efforts should be made to expand the customer base of the company through effective marketing activities.

The Company plans to acquire maximum market share of the State of Kerala. The dealer network for motor starters has already been expanded throughout the State by appointing new dealers/revitalizing the old dealers and through proper sales promotion.

The Company is also planning to build up a strong dealer network for marketing energy meters in the State, taking into consideration the recent KSBB proposal allowing consumers to purchase meter. The Company envisages to achieve full coverage for their brand meter in all dealer outlets in the State.

The Company is planning to revitalize the marketing of motor starters outside the State by appointing new distributors especially in the State of Maharashtra, Rajasthan, Gujarat, etc. The Company also plan to undate the product mix of control gears with fully automatic and Flux Controlled Magnetic Amplifier starters (FCMA). with the introduction of

these type of starters,. Company can have more business for motor starters.

The Company has already submitted its offers for supply of energy meters to State Electricity Boards of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Pondicherry etc. The Company anticipates that order from other States will materialize with the introduction of new products such as Maximum Demand Meter, Liquid Crystaf Display Meter etc.
