REPORT

The Report deals with the Action Taken by Government on the recommendations contained in the Thirty Ninth Report of the Committee (2001-2004) relating to Kerala State Film Development Corporation Ltd. based on the Report of the Comptroller and Auditor General of India for the year ended March 31, 2000 (Commercial) which was presented to the House on 30th July 2003.

The Report contains ten recommendations. Government have furnished replies to all recommendations. The Committee (2006-2008) considered the replies received from Government at its meeting held on 9-1-2008.

The Committee accepted the replies to the recommendations No. 2(51), 4(53), 7(56), 8(57) and 10(59) without any remarks. These recommendations and its replies furnished by government form Chapter I of the Report.

The replies to the recommendations No. 1(50), 3(52), 5(54), 6(55) and 9(58) were accepted by the Committee with remarks. These recommendations, their replies furnished by government and the remarks of the Committee form Chapter II of the Report.

	50	Cultural Affairs	The Committee observes that the Kerala State Film Development Corporation was constituted with a novel idea of transplanting the Malayalam film industry from Chennai to Kerala. But even after long years of its existence, the KSFDC has not been fully successful in achieving this goal. The main reason attributed by the Company is the lack of modern facility in the studio and the laboratory. Apart from this, the inability of the Company to extend financial assistance to the filmmakers is also one of the reasons for the shortfall in the number of films that have come out through KSFDC. Still it is encouraging to see that during the period of two years from 2000 to 2002 KSFDC had undertaken works on 60 films whereas for the period of five years from 1995 – 2000, the Company could undertake works on 44 Malayalam film only. The Committee would like to point out that the film	The Company has prepared a detailed project report/proposal during the year 2004 for modernization/expansion of studio with the project cost of Rs.158 lakhs and Government have permitted the company to approach commercial banks and other financial institutions for financial help. The Company has approached commercial banks and co-operative banks for financing modernization programme and it is now under process. In the case of private participation for modernization of the company.

industry is facing a tough time and the technique and concepts are changing day by day. The whole process of filmmaking is being digitalized. In such a circumstance if modern facilities are not provided, ultimately the studio complex would have to be shut down. Hence technology gradation and modernization of the studio complex is highly inevitable. Even though in the past the State Government had allotted funds for modernization, the Company had not utilized the funds but diverted it since the money was inadequate for the modernization process. The Committee, therefore recommends that the proposal of the Company for modernization should be considered and make available the necessary funds on a priority basis. The Committee that learns certain entrepreneurs have shown interest in investing in the state and suggests that the Company themselves could identify potential investors and go in for tie up with them in their expansion/ modernization programme. The Committee also (1) (2) (3) (4) (5)

suggests that whenever a contract is made in this connection, the Company should take utmost care to see that the ownership of the land should always rests with the Company.
