RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE THIRD SESSION OF TENTH KERALA LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

The summons for the Third Session of Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly were issued to Members on 24-10-1996. The Session commenced at 8.30 a.m. on Monday, November, 11, 1996 and adjourned sine-die at 1.55 p.m. on November 19, 1996. There were altogether 7 days of sittings. The House transacted business for 47 hours and 57 minutes.
