RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE THIRD
SESSION OF THE ELEVENTH KERALA LEGISLATIVE
ASSEMBLY

The Summons for the Third Session of the Eleventh Kerala Legislative Assembly was issued on February 4, 2002. The Session commenced at 9.00 a.m. on Friday, March 1, 2002 and adjourned sine-die at 12.30 p.m. on March 15, 2002. Even though 21 days of sitting were scheduled till 11-4-2002, as per the Calendar, 11 days of sitting were cancelled based on the decision of the Business Advisory Committee held on 13-3-2002. The House met on the following ten days viz., March 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 13, 14, 15, 2002. The House transacted business for 41 hrs. and 51 minutes.

Governor's Address:

The Governor, Justice Sukhdev Singh Kang addressed the Members of the Legislative Assembly at 9.00 a.m. on March 1, 2002.

(As soon as the Governor began his address to the Assembly the Leader of Opposition also went on reading out a statement. Subsequently the Members belonging to the Opposition stood up showing placards and shouted slogans. Then they moved out of the Chamber and staged a Dharna at the entrance of the House.)

The discussion on the Motion of Thanks to the Governor's Address commenced on March 4, 2002 with Shri E. T. Mohammed Basheer moving the following motion:

"The Members of the Kerala Legislative Assembly thank the Governor for his Address delivered to the Members of the Legislative Assembly on March 1, 2002."

Since Members who had given notice for moving amendments were not present in the House the amendments were not moved.

The discussion on the Motion of Thanks to the Governor's Address continued on March 5 and 6. The Motion was adopted unanimously on March 6, 2002. 28 Members including Chief Minister participated in the discussion. (Members belonging to the Opposition did not participate in the discussion).

On March 11, 2002 the Speaker reported to the Assembly the Governors' Reply to the Motion of Thanks adopted by the House.

Obituary Reference:

On March 4, 2002 the Speaker made a reference on the demise of Shri G. M. C. Balayogi, Lok Sabha Speaker. Shri A. K. Antony, Chief Minister and Shri Koc iyeri Balakrishnan, C. P. I. (M) Parliamentary Party Deputy Leader associated themselves with the sentiments expressed by the Chair and the House adjourned for 45 minutes.

On March 11, 2002, the Speaker made reference regarding the demise of Smt. Suseela Gopalan, Shri M. Thomas and Shri Thomas Kallampally, former Members of the Kerala Legislative Assembly, Shri Arangil Sreedharan, former Member, Rajya Sabha and Dr. R. Prasannan, former Secretary, Kerala Legislative Assembly.

As a mark of respect to the deceased, the House stood in silence for a while.

No adjournment motion was admitted during the Session. Details of adjournment motions in respect of which consent was withheld after hearing the views of Ministers concerned on the floor of the House are given in Appendix I.

Announcement by the Speaker:

On March 11, 2002 the Speaker informed that a cash award of Rs. 5,000 will be given to the K.S.R.T.C. driver for the exceptional bravery shown by him when the bus was stoned on its way to MLA Hostel on March 8, 2002.

Correction in Budget Speech and Documents:

On March 11, 2002 Shri K. Sankaranarayanan, Minister for Finance and Excise laid on the Table the statement correcting the error on paras 5, 20, 114, 123 and 135 in the Budget Speech 2002-2003 and in the Budget documents as an item out of agenda.

Motion for Suspension of Rule:

On March 13, 2002, the House adopted the following Motion moved by Shri M. M. Hassan, Minister for Information and Parliamentary Affairs.

“As it has become apparent that the subject committees could not complete the scrutiny of Demands for Grants in the Budget for the financial year 2002-2003 within the time stipulated under Rule 142 and 236(2) of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Kerala Legislative Assembly, this House hereby resolve that rule 236(2) be suspended till the commencement of the next session to enable the Subject Committees to complete the scrutiny.”

Question of Breach of Privilege

On March 15, 2002 Speaker informed the House that consent has been withheld to the following notices of question of breach of privilege:

1. Notice given by Shri T. K. Balan alleging that the reply given by the Minister for Local Self Government to a submission moved in the House on October 15, 2001 was unfounded.
2. Notice given by Shri P. C. George alleging that the Reply to a submission given by the Minister for Fisheries and Tourism on November 23, 2001 was unfounded.

Speaker also informed that the following notices were under the consideration of the Chair:

1. Notice given by Shri Kodyeri Balakrishnan and Shri K. P. Rajendran alleging that the Minister for Finance and Excise had given false information while replying to a submission on December 7, 2001.
2. Notice given by Shri Kodyeri Balakrishnan against the Minister for Agriculture and Coir alleging that correction had been made in the Kerala Agricultural University (Amendment) Bill, 2001 which was passed by the Assembly and forwarded to the Governor for his assent.

2. *Bill Introduced*

The Kerala Finance Bill, 2002 was introduced in the Assembly on 14th March, 2002.

Financial Business

1. *Budget for 2002-2003*

The Budget for 2002-2003 was presented in the House on March 8, 2002 by the Hon'ble Minister for Finance and Excise. The General discussion on the Budget commenced on 11th March, 2002 and continued on March 13, 2002 also. The House devoted 9 hrs. and 19 minutes for this Business. 36 members including the Minister for Finance and Excise participated in the discussion.

2. *Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2001-2002*

On March 4, 2002, the Minister for Finance and Excise laid on the Table the final Supplementary Financial statement for the year 2001-2002. Discussion and Voting on the final Supplementary Demands for Grants for the financial year 2001-2002 took place on 7th March, 2002. 11 Members including the Minister for Finance and Excise participated in the discussion and the Assembly devoted 2 hrs. and 33 minutes for the discussion.

The Kerala Appropriation (No. 1) Bill, 2002 in respect of the final Supplementary Demands for Grants for the Financial Year 2001-2002 was introduced in the House on 14-3-2002. The Bill was taken into consideration and passed on the same day after detailed discussion.

3. *Vote on Account*

Vote on Account for four months (April-July) of the financial year 2002-2003 was presented on 8th March, 2002. The Discussion and Voting on the Demands for Vote on Account for the year 2002-2003 took place on 14th March 2002. 115 Notices for Amendments to the motion were received. 18 Members (including the Minister for Finance, Minister for Agriculture and Coir and Minister for Education) participated in the discussion. The Assembly devoted 3 hrs. and 44 minutes for the discussion.

The Kerala Appropriation (Vote on Account) (No. 2) Bill, 2002 in respect of the Demands for Grants for the four months (April—July, 2002) of the financial year 2002-2003 was introduced in the House by the Minister for Finance and Excise on 14-3-2002. The Bill was taken into consideration and was passed on the same day.

Private Members' Business

According to the Calendar of Sittings of the Third Session of the Eleventh Kerala Legislative Assembly, Private Members Business was set down for two days viz. March 15, 2002 and April 5, 2002. But the Business earmarked for 5th April, 2002 could not be transacted since the house adjourned sine-die on March 15, 2002.

Private Members' Bills

On March 15, 2002, motions for leave to introduce nine Bills came up before the House. All the motions were opposed by the Minister for Information and Parliamentary Affairs. Discussion on all the Bills was inconclusive.

SALIENT FEATURES OF BILLS PASSED DURING THE
THIRD SESSION1. **The Kerala Appropriation (No. 1) Bill, 2002**

The Bill was introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article, 205 thereof, to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala required to meet the supplementary expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala and the Grants made by the Legislative Assembly for the expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the Financial Year 2001-2002.

2. **The Kerala Appropriation (Vote on Account) (No. 2) Bill, 2002**

The Bill was introduced in pursuance of Article 204(1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 206 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys required to meet the expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State and the Grants made in advance by the Legislative Assembly in respect of the estimated expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the part of the Financial Year 2002-2003.
