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RESUME OF BUSINESS TRANSACTED DURING THE SIXTH SESSION OF THE ELEVENTH KERALA LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

The summons dated May 21, 2003 for the Sixth session of Eleventh Kerala Legislative Assembly were issued to the Members on May 26, 2003. The session commenced at 8.30 a.m. on Monday, June 16, 2003 and adjourned sine-die at 2.44 p.m. on Thursday, August 14, 2003. Even though 45 days of sittings were scheduled as per the calendar, 4 days of sittings were cancelled. On July 9, 2003, the Speaker informed that the House will sit for an afternoon session at 3.30 p.m. on Thursday, July 10, 2003 to discuss a notice given by Shri V. S. Achuthanandan, Leader of Opposition, under rule 58.

Statement by Minister

On July 7, 2003, The Minister for Health made a statement correcting the answer to a submission made by the Leader of Opposition on 26-6-2003.

Motion for Extension of time

The motion for extension of time moved by Shri K. Sudhakaran Minister for Forests and Sports on 4-8-2003, for presentation of Report of the Select Committee on the Kerala Forest (Vesting and Management of Ecologically Fragile Lands) Bill, 2001 till August, 4, 2003 was adopted by the House.

Discussion under Rule 58

(1) On July 10, 2003, Shri V. S. Achuthanandan, Leader of Opposition raised a discussion under Rule 58 on the situation that has arisen consequent on the spreading of fever throughout the State.

After the discussion, Shri P. Sankaran, Minister for Health and Shri A. K. Antony, Chief Minister replied to the points raised in the discussion.

(2) On August 4, 2003 Shri K. C. Joseph raised a discussion on Dr. Swaminathan Commission Report.

After the discussion Smt. K. R. Gouri Amma, Minister for Agriculture and Coir replied to the points raised in the discussion.

Motion under Rule 130

On August 6, 2003, Shri T. M. Jacob, Minister for Water Resources moved the following motion under Rule 130.

Shri T. M. Jacob, Minister for Water Resources and Shri A. K. Antony, Chief Minister replied to the points raised in the discussion. Then the following substantive motion under Rule 275 moved by the Minister for Water Resources was passed unanimously by the House.

പമ്പാനദിയിൽ നിന്നും അച്ചൻകോവിലാറിൽനിന്നും വെള്ളം തമിഴ്നാട്ടിലേക്ക് തിരിച്ചുവിടുന്നത് ഇവിടെ രൂക്ഷമായ ജലക്ഷാമവും പരിസ്മിതി പ്രശ്നങ്ങളും സൃഷ്ടിക്കുമെന്നതിനാലും;

പമ്പാനദിയിലും അച്ചൻകോവിലാറിലും ഹൈഡൽ പ്രോജക്ടുകളും ശുദ്ധജല വിതരണ പദ്ധതികളും നടപ്പിലാക്കേണ്ടതായിട്ടുള്ളതിനാലും;

പമ്പാനദിയും അച്ചൻകോവിലാറും ദ്രോണസംസ്കൃതമായി ആവിഷ്കരിച്ചിട്ടുള്ള കൃഷിവെള്ള പദ്ധതികളിൽ ഇപ്പോൾ തന്നെ ജലമേൽവെച്ചും അനുബന്ധിക്കുന്നതിനാലും;

കൂട്ടനാടിന്റെ സത്തുലിതാവസ്ഥ തന്നെ തകിടം മറിക്കുന്നതാണ് പമ്പ-അച്ചൻകോവിൽ-വൈപ്പാർ ലിങ്ക് പദ്ധതിയെന്നു സി. ഡബ്ല്യൂ. ജെ. ഡി. എം.-ന്റെ പഠനങ്ങൾ വ്യക്തമാക്കിയിട്ടുള്ളതിനാലും;

സംസ്ഥാനത്തിന്റെ പ്രതിരോധം വകവെക്കാനെ ഈ പദ്ധതിയുമായി ദേശീയ ജലവികസന ഏജൻസി മുന്നോട്ട് പോകുന്ന സാഹചര്യത്തിലും;

പമ്പ-അച്ചൻകോവിൽ-വൈപ്പാർ ലിങ്ക് പദ്ധതി പൂർണ്ണമായും ഉപേക്ഷിക്കണമെന്നു ഈ സഭ ഐക്യബഹുജന കേന്ദ്ര സർക്കാരിനോട് അഭ്യർത്ഥിക്കുന്നു.”

Statements under Rule 300:

On June 24, 2003 Shri Chetkalam Abdulla, Minister for Local Self Government made a statement regarding the various measures adopted by Local Self Government Department to control the spread of epidemics

On August, 14, 2003, Shri A. K. Antony, Chief Minister made a statement regarding the Supreme Court verdict directing the Self Financing Colleges to admit 50% of the students from the merit list prepared by the Commissioner of Entrance Examinations.

Government Resolution

On July 18, 2003, the following resolution moved by the Minister for Water Resources on behalf of the Minister for Education, regarding the taking over of L. P. School, Kottangal by the Government was unanimously passed by the House without discussion:

“WHEREAS the management of the Kottangal Aided L. P. School of Thiruvalla Educational District in Pathanamthitta Revenue District was taken over by the Government for five years since it was not functioning properly due to mismanagement:

AND WHEREAS after the expiry of the said period as authorised by Government the District Collector, Pathanamthitta is discharging the functions of the manager in the interest of the public and the pupils of the School;

AND WHEREAS no person has raised any claim in the ownership and title in respect of the land, building or other properties of the said school;

AND WHEREAS, in O. P. No. 25610 of 2000-W, the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala has directed the State Government to consider the acquisition of the said school;

AND WHEREAS the Government proposed to take over the said school in public interest under sub-section (1) of section 15 of the Kerala Education Act, 1958 (6 of 1959), for managing the same more effectively;

AND WHEREAS under the proviso to sub-section (1) of section 15 of the said Act, a notification under the sub-section shall not be issued unless the proposal of the Government for the take over is supported by a resolution of the Legislative Assembly;

Now, THEREFORE, this House hereby resolves to support the proposal of Government to take over the Kottangal Aided L. P. School of Thiruvalla Educational District in Pathanamthitta Revenue District under sub-section (1) of section 15 of the Kerala Education Act, 1958”.

Resolution adopted by the House

On July 10, 2003 the following resolution moved by Shri Oommen Chandy pursuant to the consensus of the House arrived at during a Calling Attention on 7th July, 2003 was unanimously adopted by the House.

Consideration of Amendments to Rules given notice of by Members

(1) On August 11, 2003 the amendment to Notification G. O. (P) No.97/03/Co-op. dated April 9, 2003 (S.R. O. No.326/2003) containing amendments to the Kerala Co-operative Societies (Amendment) Rules 2003 given notice of by Shri A. K. Balan was considered. After reply by the Minister for Revenue and Law, the amendment was put to vote and declared lost.

(2) On August 11, 2003 the amendments to Notification G.O. (P) No. 19/2003/GAD dated January 9, 2003 (S.R.O. No. 22/2003) containing amendments to the Kerala Public Service Commission (Composition and Conditions of Service of Members and Staff) Amendment Regulation, 2003 given notice of by Shri K. Kutty Ahammed Kutty was considered. After reply by the Chief Minister, the amendments were partially accepted. Remaining amendments were withdrawn with the leave of the House.

Leave of Absence from Sittings to the House

On June 20, 2003, the House granted Leave of absence from the Sittings of the current Session of the House to Shri K. N. A. Khader.

Correction of answer to Unstarred Questions

On June 25, 2003 corrected answer to Unstarred Question No. 1226 dated 26-6-2002 and Unstarred Question No. 480 dated 30-1-2003 were laid on the Table by the Minister for Forests and Sports as an out of Agenda item.

Greetings

On July 15, 2003, the Speaker extended greetings to Smt. K. R. Gouri Amma, Minister for Agriculture and Coir on her eighty fourth birthday.

Question of Breach of Privilege:

1. On August 14, 2003 the Speaker informed that the question of breach of privilege against Fr. Abraham Kakkannattu, Director, Pushpagiri Medical College, based on his derogatory statement about the Speaker and the Leader of Opposition made in a Press Conference was referred to the Committee of Privileges and Ethics, under Rule 159.

2. The Speaker also announced that consent was withheld to the following notices of question of breach of privilege.

Financial Business:

I. *Budget for 2003-2004:*

The discussion and voting on Demands for Grants in the Budget for the financial year 2003-04 commenced on 24th June, 2003. Thirteen days were allotted for discussion on Demands for Grants.

Out of 1354 cut motions received, 829 were moved and disposed of. There were 224 occasions for speech including reply by the Ministers in connection with the discussion and voting on Demands for Grants.

The Assembly devoted 48 Hours and 52 minutes for transacting Financial business relating to the Budget for 2003-04. The details are given in Appendix IX.

The Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 2003, in respect of the Budget for the year 2003-04 was introduced by the Minister for Finance on 21-7-2003. The Bill was taken up for consideration and passed on the same day.

II. *Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2003-04 and Demands for Excess Grants for the year 1989-90, 1990-91, 1991-92, 1992-93, 1995-96, 1997-98, 1998-99 and 1999-2000*

On July 25th 2003, the Minister for Finance laid the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2003-04, and Demands for Excess Grants for the years 1989-90, 1990-91, 1991-92, 1992-93, 1995-96, 1997-98, 1998-99

and 1999-2000. Discussion and voting on the Supplementary Demands and Demands for Excess Grants took place on July 29th, 2003 and the House devoted 3 hours and 33 minutes for the transaction of the Business.

The Kerala Appropriation (No.3) Bill, 2003, in respect of the Supplementary Demands for Grants for the year 2003-04 and the Kerala Appropriation (No. 4, 5,6,7,8, 9, 10& 11) Bills, 2003 in respect of the Demands for Excess Grants for the years 1989-90, 1990-91, 1991-92, 1992-93, 1995-96, 1997-98, 1998-99, and 1999-2000 were introduced in the Assembly on July 30th, 2003. The Bills were taken into consideration and passed on the same day.

Private Members Business:

According to the calendar of sittings of the Sixth Session of the Eleventh Kerala Legislative Assembly, 8 days were set apart for Private Members' Business i.e., on June 20, 27, July 4, 11, 18, 25 and August 1, 8, 2003. In addition to these as per the 13th Report of Business Advisory Committee, 22nd August, 2003 was also allotted for Private Members' Business. However, the Business for 4th July and 22nd August, 2003 were not transacted, since there were no sitting on these days. Out of the seven days, three days i.e. 20th June, 18th July and 1st August were set apart for Private Members' Bills and 27th June, 11th July 25th July and 8th August were set apart for Private Members' Resolutions:

Private Members' Bills:

During the session, notice for 21 motions for leave to introduce Bills came up before the House. All the motions for leave to introduce the Bills were opposed by the Minister for Information and Parliamentary Affairs. The motion for leave to introduce four bills were withdrawn by leave of the House. Discussion on 17 Bills were inconclusive.

Details regarding the name of members who moved the motion for leave to introduce the Bills and the results thereof are given in Appendix XA and XB.

Private Members Resolutions:

During the session, notice for 12 resolutions given by Dr. A. Neelalohithadasan Nadar, Shri E.M. Augusthy, Shri T.P.M. Sahir, Shri Mankode Radhakrishnan, Shri Stephen George, Shri P.J. Joy, Shri Prayar Gopalakrishnan, Shri Varkala Kahar, Shri Saju Paul, Shri K.K. Ramachandran Master, Shri M.V. Jayarajan and Shri P.T. Thomas were received. Discussion on Resolution given notice by Shri P.K.K. Bava (moved by Shri K. Kutty Abammed Kutty) which was discussed in the previous session was continued

and was rejected by the House. Resolutions of Shri T. P. M. Sahir, Shri Stephen George, Shri P. J. Joy, Shri Varkala Kahar, Shri Saju Paul and Shri M. V. Jayarajan were not moved for want of time. Resolution of Dr. A. Neelalohithadasan Nadar and Shri Mankode Radhakrishnan (moved by Shri Binoy Viswam) were rejected by the House. The Resolution of Shri K. K. Ramachandran Master was withdrawn by leave of the House. The Resolutions moved by Shri E. M. Augusthy and Shri Prayar Gopalakrishnan were adopted unanimously. Discussion on the Resolution given notice by Shri P. T. Thomas (moved by Shri Thampanoor Ravi) was inconclusive.

APPENDIX VI

Salient features of the Bills Passed

**THE KERALA STAY OF EVICTION PROCEEDINGS
(AMENDMENT) BILL, 2003**

The period of the Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings Act, 2001 (11 of 2001) which was intended to protect the small holders and cultivating tenants for a temporary period who are under threat of eviction or dispossession from the land purchased or otherwise acquired for consideration evidenced by registered documents, or otherwise have to be expired on 31st March, 2003. But, necessary amendments are to be made in the existing Kerala Land Reforms Act to protect the said small holders and cultivating tenants. On considering the procrastination in this regard, the Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings (Amendment) Ordinance, 2003 was promulgated by the Governor on 29th March, 2003 to extend the period of operation of the Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceedings Act, 2001 for a further period of one year and it was published in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 538.

As per sub-clause (b) of clause (2) of article 213 of the Constitution of India, the Bill to replace the Ordinance has to be introduced in and passed within six weeks of the Session of the Legislative Assembly.

As steps have not been completed to make amendments in the Kerala Land Reforms Act, Government consider it necessary to pass an Act to replace the Kerala Stay of Eviction Proceeding Ordinance, 2003 (1 of 2003).

This Bill is intended to achieve the above object.

THE KERALA PANCHAYAT RAJ (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2003.

The Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in its common judgment dated, 4th February, 2003 in O. P. No. 29473/2000 and 31223/2000 has set aside the election of certain Councillors of Irinjalakkuda Municipality and a member of the Vallathol Nagar Grama Panchayat for the reason that the oath or affirmation made by them were not in the prescribed form when they submitted their nomination paper. The Government was satisfied that there is a likelihood of setting aside the election in certain Panchayats for the reason that such oath or affirmation has not been made in the prescribed form. In this circumstances administrative crisis occurred in the Vallathol Nagar Grama Panchayat. The Government has satisfied that there is likelihood of occurring administrative crisis in some other Panchayats also.

2. This has happened because even though the First Schedule of the Kerala Panchayat Raj Act, 1994 was amended as per the Kerala Panchayat Raj (Amendment) Act, 1999 (13 of 1999), the form existed before the commencement of the amendment has been printed and issued instead of the form as amended. It has become necessary that the elected members shall not be disqualified for the reason that they have submitted the nomination paper not in the prescribed form. For the purpose Government have decided to make necessary amendment in clause (e) of Section 29 of the Kerala Panchayat Raj Act, 1994. As the State Legislative Assembly was not in session and the circumstance existed for an immediate legislation to implement the aforesaid decision, the Governor of Kerala promulgated the Local Self Government Institution Laws (Amendment) Ordinance, 2003, which was published as Ordinance No. 2 of 2003 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 530 dated, 29th March, 2003.

3. The Bill seeks to replace Section 3 of the aforesaid Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature.

THE KERALA MUNICIPALITY (SECOND AMENDMENT)

BILL, 2003

The Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in its common judgment dated 4th February, 2003 in O. P. No. 29473/2000 and 31223/2000 has set aside the election of certain Councillors of Irinjalakuda Municipality and a member of the Vallathol Nagar Grama Panchayat for the reason that the oath and affirmation made by them were not in the prescribed form when they submitted their nomination paper. The Government was satisfied that there is a likelihood of setting aside the election in certain Municipalities for the reason that such oath and affirmation has not been made in the prescribed form. In this circumstances administrative crisis occurred in the Irinjalakuda Municipality and the Government has satisfied that there is likelihood of occurring administrative crisis in some other Municipalities also.

2. This has happened because even though the Second Schedule of the Kerala Municipality Act, 1994 has amended as per the Kerala Municipality (Amendment) Act, 1999 (14 of 1999), the form existed before the commencement of the amendment has been printed and issued instead of the form as amended and it leads to be happened in such a way. It has become necessary that the elected Councillors shall not be disqualified for the reason that they have submitted the nomination paper not in the prescribed form. For the purpose, Government have decided to make necessary amendment in clause (f) of Section 85 of the Kerala Municipality Act, 1994. As the Legislative Assembly of the State was not in session and the circumstances existed for the immediate legislation to implement the above said decision, the Governor of Kerala promulgated

the Local Self Government Institution Laws (Amendment) Ordinance 2003 which was published as Ordinance No. 2 of 2003 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 530 dated, 29th March, 2003.

3. This Bill seeks to replace Sections 4 and 5 of the above said Ordinance, by an Act of the State Legislature.

THE KERALA GENERAL SALES TAX (SECOND AMENDMENT) BILL, 2003

Section 30 C of the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963 provides for the confiscation by Authorised officers of certain specified goods, namely, coffee, rubber, cardamom, ginger, pepper, anacard, cashewnut, iron and steel, when they are smuggled into and out of the State along with the vehicle or vessel used for such smuggling. The Hon'ble High Court of Kerala in its Judgement in O. P. No. 98/56 has struck down the above provision being unconstitutional mainly on the ground that section 30C of the Kerala General Sales Tax Act gives very wide and arbitrary power by not defining the word "smuggling". In order to curb evasion of tax and the consequent revenue loss, and taking into consideration the basis of the decision of the Hon'ble High Court in the O. P. aforesaid, Government have decided to amend suitably section 2 and to incorporate new sections 30E and 30F to the Act.

2. Sub-section (7B) of section 7 of the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963 provides for deduction of tax on works contracts at specified rate by awarders when they make payment to contractors and for committing the same to the Government. In the judgement in O. P. No. 3056/2001 the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala has struck down sub-section (7B) of section 7 of the Act as its beyond the legislative competency of the State, so long as it does not exclude inter-State Sales etc. from its ambit. In order to overcome the revenue loss arising out of the said judgement Government have decided to amend suitably section 22 and to incorporate a new sub section (7C) of section 7 to the Act. Government have also decided to make certain other consequential amendments to the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963.

3. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and the proposal had to be implemented urgently, the Kerala General Sales Tax Amendment Ordinance, 2003 was promulgated by the Governor on the 22nd April, 2003 and it was published as Ordinance No. 4 of 2003 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 666 dated the 24th April, 2003.

4. This Bill seeks to replace the Ordinance No. 4 of 2003 by an Act of the State Legislature.

**THE KERALA GENERAL SALES TAX (THIRD AMENDMENT)
BILL, 2003**

As per section 5 D of the Kerala General Sales Tax Act, 1963, the tax payable under section 5 and 5A shall be increased by an additional sales tax at the rate of fifteen per cent and the levy of additional sales tax shall be for the period upto 31st March, 2003. In view of the postponement of the implementation of the Value Added Tax (VAT) system of taxation, Government have decided to levy additional sales tax for the period upto 31st March, 2004.

The Bill is intended to achieve the above object.

**THE PAYMENT OF SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES
(AMENDMENT) BILL, 2003**

At present the Ministers, the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of Opposition and the Chief Whip are not entitled to constituency allowance. Therefore the Government have decided to provide constituency allowance of Rs. 2,500 per month to them.

2. As per sub-section (2) of section 6, the Ministers, the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of the Opposition and the Chief Whip shall be paid a sum of Rs. 1,850 per month in lieu of the cost of petrol and oil for the conveyance for journeys performed within the city of Thiruvananthapuram and a radius of eight kilometres thereof in addition to the conveyance provided under sub-section (1). It is proposed to enhance the amount to Rs. 5,000.

3. As per clause (a2) of sub-section (1) of section 8 of the Act every member of the Legislative Assembly other than the Ministers, the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of the Opposition and the Chief Whip shall be entitled to receive a constituency allowance of Rs. 2,500 per month for meeting his expenditure for the performance of his duties as such member in his Assembly Constituency. It is proposed to enhance the amount to Rs. 3,500.

4. As per the proviso to clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 8 of the Act, a member other than the Ministers, the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of the Opposition and the Chief Whip shall be entitled to receive a minimum of Rs. 4,500 per month towards travelling allowances for journeys inside the State. It is proposed to enhance the amount to Rs. 7,500.

5. As per sub-section (5) of section 8A of the Act, a member other than the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of the Opposition, the Chief Whip and the Ministers shall be entitled to a telephone allowance of Rs. 3,000 per month in addition to the rental of the telephone for meeting its charges. It is proposed to enhance the telephone allowance to Rs. 4,000 per month.

6. As per sub-items (a) and (b) of items (1) and (2) of paragraph 1 of the Schedule to the Act, the Ministers, the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of Opposition and the Chief Whip shall be given travelling allowance for journeys inside and outside the State, at the rate of Rs. 4 per kilometre and a daily allowance at the rate of Rs. 300, and as per sub-item (c) of item (1) of paragraph 1, for journeys by train they are entitled to actual fare plus 25 paise per kilometre for incidental expense.

It is proposed to enhance the rate for travelling allowance by road inside and outside the State to Rs. 6 per kilometre and daily allowance for halt at the rate of Rs. 500. It is also proposed to enhance the incidental expense to 50 paise per kilometre for journey by train. The incidental expenses for journeys in Government vehicles is also proposed to be fixed to paise 50 per kilometre.

7. As per items (1) in paragraph III of the Schedule to the Act, the members of the Legislative Assembly shall be given travelling allowance at the rate of Rs. 2.50 per kilometre for journey by road inside and outside the State and daily allowance of Rs. 200. It is proposed to enhance the said travelling allowance to Rs. 4 per kilometre and the daily allowance to Rs. 400.

8. In order to cope up with the increase in the diesel, petrol and telephone charges, Government have decided to enhance the existing rate of allowances as proposed to the Ministers, the Speaker, the Deputy Speaker, the Leader of the Opposition, the Chief Whip and Members of the Legislature by amending the payment of Salaries and Allowances Act, 1951 (Act XIV of 1951).

9. The Bill seeks to amend the Payment of Salaries and Allowances Act to achieve the above objects.

THE KERALA PAYMENT OF PENSION TO MEMBERS OF LEGISLATURE (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2003

As per the Schedule to the Kerala Payment of Pension to Members of Legislature Act, 1976 (46 of 1976) the existing rate of pension admissible to the persons who have been Members of the Legislature are as follows:

2. In order to cope up with the increasing standard of living and price index, Government have decided to enhance the existing rate of pension to the Members of the Legislature under the Kerala Payment of Pension to Members of Legislature Act, 1976.

3. Government have decided to enhance the rate of pension as follows:—

4. It has also been decided to enhance the additional pension for a period exceeding five years from Rs. 400 to Rs. 500 per mensem for every year in excess of five years. The limit of maximum pension to which a member is eligible under the Act, is also proposed to be enhanced from Rs. 7,500 to Rs. 12,500 per mensem.

5. The Bill seeks to amend the Kerala Payment of Pension to Members of Legislature Act, 1976 to achieve the above objects.

THE KERALA FINANCE BILL, 2003

The Bill seeks to amend the following enactments to give effect to certain financial proposals of the Government of Kerala for the financial year 2003-04, namely:—

1. The Abkari Act, 1077 (1 of 1077).
2. The Kerala Tax on Luxuries Act, 1976 (32 of 1976).
3. The Kerala Tax on Entry of Goods into Local Areas Act, 1994 (15 of 1994).

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 2) BILL, 2003

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys required to meet the expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State and the grants made by the Legislative Assembly in respect of the estimated expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the financial Year 2003-2004.

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 3) BILL, 2003

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala required to meet the supplementary expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala and the Grants made by the Legislative Assembly for the expenditure of the Government of Kerala for the Financial Year 2003-2004.

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 4) BILL, 2003

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the Appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1989-90.

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 5) BILL, 2003

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the Appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1990-91.

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 6) BILL, 2003

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the Appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial year 1991-92.

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 7) BILL, 2003

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1992-93.

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 8) BILL, 2003

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the money to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1995-96.

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 9) BILL, 2003

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the Appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1997-98.

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 10) BILL, 2003

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the Appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1998-99.

THE KERALA APPROPRIATION (No. 11) BILL, 2003

The Bill is introduced in pursuance of Article 204 (1) of the Constitution of India, read with Article 205 thereof, to provide for the appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Kerala of the moneys to meet the amounts spent on certain services in excess of the amounts granted for those services for the Financial Year 1999-2000.

THE KERALA PRESERVATION OF TREES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2003

The Kerala Preservation of Trees Act, 1986, was enacted for restricting the indiscriminate felling and destruction of trees in the State. Section 4 of the Act imposes restriction on cutting of trees as defined in clause (e) of section 2 which includes only ten species of trees, namely, Sandalwood, Teak, Rosewood, Irul, Thempavu, Kampakam, Chempakam, Chadachi, Chandana-veempu and Cheeni.

2. In O.P. No. 30589/01 initiated by the Honourable High Court of Kerala on the basis of an anonymous letter alleging large scale illegal removal of valuable timber from the Wayanad forests under dubious title deeds, the Honourable High Court in its interim direction has imposed a total ban on cutting and removal of any tree in Wayanad district. The above direction has put an abrupt end to all timber based activities in Wayanad district. The difficulties being experienced by the common man in Wayanad district due to the blanket ban imposed by the High Court has come to the notice of Government. The Government, is satisfied that the ban on cutting and removal of timber in the district has adversely affected even small land holders. Hence the Government have decided to amend the Kerala Preservation of Trees Act, 1986 (35 of 1986), to provide specifically that the registered holders or patta holders can cut from their lands any tree other than a tree as defined in clause (e) of section 2 of the said Act without obtaining permission under section 4 of the Act.

3. The Bill seeks to achieve the above object.

THE KERALA FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY BILL, 2003

The fiscal reforms policy of State Government envisages a new legislation to provide for the responsibility of the Government to ensure prudence in fiscal management and fiscal stability by progressive elimination of revenue deficit and sustainable debt management. Under this policy Government proposes to lay before the Legislative Assembly every year a Medium Term Fiscal Policy Statement and a Fiscal Policy Strategy Statement along with the Annual Budget, to take appropriate measures to reduce revenue deficit and build up an adequate revenue surplus, to ensure greater transparency in fiscal operations and to make appropriate measures to review periodically the progress of public expenditure with reference to the fiscal targets of the Government.

The Bill is intended to achieve the above objects.

THE KERALA CEILING ON GOVERNMENT GUARANTEES BILL, 2002

Ceiling on Government guarantee is a *sine qua non* for economic progress and for promoting fiscal discipline of the State and to avoid fiscal risk on the State budget. The Government have been providing guarantee to Government Departments, Public Sector Undertakings, Local Authorities, Statutory Boards, Corporations and Co-operative Institutions to raise funds from Financial Institutions/Banks. In such cases Government levy guarantee commission from the beneficiary institution @ 0.75% per annum of the total amount of guarantee and allow rebate of 0.25% for prompt payment. Many of the Public Sector Undertakings, Statutory Boards, Corporations, Co-operative Institutions etc., have been avoiding payment of guarantee commission on one pretext or other. Thus, crores of rupees are due to Government by way of arrears of guarantee commission. The guarantee commission is both a service charge for the risk that Government takes while issuing guarantee and a disincentive to unbridled requests for excessive guarantees.

However, in recent years there has been an increasing demand for Government guarantees at the instance of Banks and Financial Institutions due to new provisioning norms of the Reserve Bank of India. At the same time, the liability of the Government is increasing manifold because Government guarantees cover not only the principal portion but future interests and penalties as well. Thus, it has become imperative, in the interest of prudent financial management to fix a ceiling on the quantum of Government guarantee. The Technical Committee constituted by Reserve Bank of India also strongly recommended fixing an upper limit for guarantees. This is also a constitutional requirement under Article 293 (1) of the Constitution of India. Government have therefore decided to fix ceiling on giving Government guarantees.

The Bill is intended to achieve the above objects.

THE KERALA IRRIGATION AND WATER CONSERVATION BILL, 2003

At present the following enactments relating to Irrigation are in force in the different parts of the State, namely:—

- (i) The Madras Irrigation Cess Act, 1865 (VII of 1865).
- (ii) The Madras Irrigation (Voluntary Cess) Act, 1942 (XIII of 1942).
- (iii) The Madras Irrigation Works (Repairs, Improvement and Constructor) Act, 1943 (XVIII of 1943).

- (iv) The Malabar Irrigation Works (Construction and Levy of Cess) Act, 1947 (VII of 1947).
- (v) The Madras Irrigation Tanks (Improvement) Act, 1949 (XIX of 1949).
- (vi) The Madras Irrigation (Levy of Betterment Contribution) Act, 1955 (3 of 1955).
- (vii) The Travancore-Cochin Irrigation Tanks (Preservation and Improvement) Act, 1952 (23 of 1952).
- (viii) The Travancore-Cochin Irrigation Act, 1956 (VII of 1956).
- (ix) The Kerala Irrigation Works (Execution by Joint Labour) Act, 1967 (20 of 1967).

2. In the light of the changed circumstances and new knowledge and policy changes in the field of irrigation, water conservation and management, dam safety, etc., it is considered necessary to enact a uniform law on the subject applicable throughout the State.

3. The Bill is intended to achieve the above purposes.

THE KERALA FOREST (VESTING AND MANAGEMENT OF ECOLOGICALLY FRAGILE LANDS) BILL, 2001

International Union for Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources (IUCN) has declared the Western Ghats as one of the Biodiversity Hotspots in the world. As a signatory to the Convention of Biological Diversity (CBD) our nation has the responsibility to conserve the biological resources for the sustained economic and social development of the society and for the maintenance of ecological stability. The Honourable Supreme Court of India has ordered that natural resources such as forests, rivers, etc. shall be conserved as Public Trust for the welfare of the society at large. The Apex Court while laying down the principle and guidelines of the 'Public Trust Doctrine' has stipulated that resources like air, sea, waters and the forest have such a great importance to the people as a whole that it would be wholly unjustified to make them a subject of private ownership. The Honourable Supreme Court has further ordered that the Public Trust Doctrine as laid down by it shall be part of the law of the land, that the State Government and the statutory authorities must anticipate prevent and attack the causes of environmental degradation and that where there are threats of serious and irreversible damage lack of scientific certainty should not be used as a reason for postponing measures to prevent environmental degradation.

2. It has been observed that many ecologically fragile areas in the State are under the private ownership. Over-exploitation and unsound management of the resources there in would lead to irreversible degradation of social economic and ecological stability of the State. As a precautionary and preventive measure the Government consider it necessary to enact a legislation to bring the ecologically fragile areas under the ownership of the State and to ensure their conservation for the welfare of the society and of the nation at large.

3. As the Legislative Assembly was not in session and as the proposal had to be given effect to immediately the Kerala Forest (Vesting and Management of Ecologically Fragile Lands) Ordinance, 2000, was promulgated by the Governor on the 1st day of June, 2000 and the same was published as Ordinance No. 6 of 2000 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1042 dated the 2nd June, 2000.

4. A Bill to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature though published as Bill No. 257 of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly could not be introduced in and passed by, the Legislative Assembly during its session which commenced on the 19th day of June 2000 and ended on the 7th day of July 2000 for want of time.

5. In order to keep alive the provisions of Ordinance No. 6 of 2000, the Kerala Forest (Vesting and Management of Ecologically Fragile Lands) Ordinance, 2000 was promulgated by the Governor on the 27th day of July, 2000 and was published as Ordinance No. 8 of 2000 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 1431 dated 27th day of July, 2000.

6. A Bill to replace the said Ordinance by an Act of the State Legislature, though published as Bill No. 277 of the Tenth Kerala Legislative Assembly, could not be introduced in, and passed by, the Legislative Assembly during its session which commenced on the 18th day of December, 2000 and ended on the 21st day of December, 2000. In order to keep alive the provisions of the Ordinance No. 8 of 2000, the Kerala Forest (Vesting and Management of Ecologically Fragile Lands) Ordinance, 2001 was promulgated by the Governor on the 26th day of January 2001 and published as Ordinance No. 3 of 2001 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 151 dated the 27th January 2001.

7. A Bill to replace Ordinance No. 3 of 2001 by an Act of the State Legislature could not be introduced in, and passed by, the Legislative Assembly during its session which commenced on the 15th day of February 2001 and ended on the 8th day of March 2001. Therefore, in order to keep alive the provisions of Ordinance No. 3 of 2001, the Kerala Forest (Vesting and Management of Ecologically Fragile Lands)

Ordinance, 2001 was promulgated by the Governor on the 13th day of March, 2001 and was published as Ordinance No.16 of 2001 in the Kerala Gazette Extraordinary No. 369 dated the 13th March 2001.

8. A Bill to replace Ordinance No. 16 of 2001 by an Act of the State Legislature could not be introduced in, and passed by, the Legislative Assembly during its session which commenced on the 5th day of June, 2001 and ended on the 23rd day of July, 2001 for want of time. Hence Ordinance No.16 of 2001 ceased to operate on the 17th day of July, 2001 under sub-clause (a) of clause (2) of Article 213 of the Constitution of India.

9. Though Ordinance No. 16 of 2001 has lapsed, the Government consider it necessary to keep the provisions of Ordinance No.16 of 2001 alive by suitable legislation.

10. The Bill seeks to achieve the above object.

THE KERALA ADVOCATES' CLERKS WELFARE FUND BILL, 2002

The Advocates' Clerks in the State of Kerala have been requesting the Government for the constitution of a statutory Welfare Fund for payment of retirement and other benefits and to make suitable legislation for the purpose. Accordingly the Government have decided to enact a legislation for the purpose of constitution of a Welfare Fund and for the constitution of a Committee for administering the fund. Necessary provisions have been made to raise fund by collecting admission fees and subscriptions from the Advocates' Clerks and by utilising a portion of the Legal Benefit Fund constituted under section 76 of the Kerala Court Fees and Suits Valuation Act, 1959. It has also been decided to make provision requiring to affix "Kerala Advocate Clerk Welfare Fund Stamp" of the face value of Rs.2 each, on every vakalath filed before any court, authority or tribunal and to bring the existing a Advocates Clerk Welfare Fund Scheme, 1985, constituted by G.O. (P) No. 3/1985/Fin. dated, 1st January, 1985 under the control and supervision of the Committee constituted under this Act.

The Bill is intended to achieve the above objects.

THE KERALA CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES AND THE KERALA STATE CO-OPERATIVE AGRICULTURAL AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT BANKS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2002

The Committee constituted to study and recommend methods to improve the working of District Co-operative Banks had recommended to introduce Gehan system in all Co-operative Societies so as to relieve the borrowers

from the obligation for registration of instruments of mortgage executed in favour of the societies. Such a facility is now available to the borrowers of loans from the Agricultural and Rural Development Bank and the Primary Banks as per the provisions of the Kerala State Co-operative Agricultural and Rural Development Banks Act, 1984. For extending the said facility to the borrowers of District Co-operative Banks and Primary Agricultural Credit Societies necessary amendments are to be made in the Kerala Co-operative Societies Act, 1969.

Even though the instruments of mortgage are exempted from registration as per the provisions of the Kerala State Co-operative Agricultural and Rural Development Banks Act, 1984, the release deeds thereof are not exempted from the requirement of registration under the provisions of the Registration Act, 1908 (Central Act 16 of 1908). Now the Government consider it necessary to exempt such release deeds also from registration. For this purpose, amendments to the Kerala State Co-operative Agricultural and Rural Development Banks Act, 1984, are necessary. Government also intend to extend the said facilities to the borrowers of loans from the District Co-operative Banks and Primary Agricultural Credit Societies.

The Bill seeks to achieve the above objects.

THE KERALA CASHEW WORKERS' RELIEF AND WELFARE FUND (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2001

As per sub-section (2) of section 5 of the Kerala Cashew Workers' Relief and Welfare Fund Act, 1979 an employees shall contribute to the fund at the rate of fifty paise for every day of work done by him in the cashew factory. Taking into account, the increase in the number and rate of various welfare benefits being disbursed to its members and the revision of minimum wages of Cashew Workers, the Kerala Cashew Workers' Relief and Welfare Fund Board has recommended to enhance the rate of contribution of employees from 50 paise to Rupee 1 per day of work.

2. As per sub-section (3A) of section 5 of the said Act, Government have to contribute by way of grant every year an amount equal to twice the amount of employees' contribution. The amendment in respect of employees contribution as recommended by the Board would lead to additional financial liability on the part of Government.

3. In the circumstances mentioned above, Government have decided to enhance the rate of employees contribution from 50 paise per day of work to Rupee 1 and to avoid the consequential additional financial liability of the

Government, it has also been decided to limit the rate of Government contribution per year to an amount equal to employees contribution by suitably amending sub-sections (2) and (3A) of section 5 of the Act.

4. The Bill seeks to amend the said Act to achieve the above object.

**THE KERALA AGRICULTURAL WORKERS
(AMENDMENT) BILL, 2001**

Sub-section (2) of section 9 of the Kerala Agricultural Workers Act, 1974 lays down that every registered Agricultural Worker shall pay contribution to the Fund at the rate of two rupees per mensem. The present rate was fixed in the year 1990. Government are convinced that considering the benefits now extended to the Agricultural Workers the present rate of contribution is not sufficient to meet the various welfare benefits being extended as per the provisions of the Scheme. So, it has been decided to increase the rate of contribution payable to the fund by the workers from Rs. 2 to Rs. 5.

2. The Bill is intended to achieve the above object.
