5-A) The Committee agreed with the proposal for exempting the Chief Secretary from the joint operation of KRSA's accounts as suggested by the Government as per the letter no.D3/152/2024-TRANS dated:23-10-2024, since the Chief Secretary is the Chief Executive of the State and the Secretary to the Council of Ministers and it is not appropriate to entrust Chief Secretary to operate the accounts of an authority functioning under the Government. The Authority decided to expedite action in this regard.

5-B) The Authority decided to enhance the financial power of the Road Safety Commissioner to sign cheques upto ₹10,00,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Crore only) and to seek concurrence of Government for the same. (Action by: KRSA)

Mobile Application for Road Safety Awareness

File No. A2/33/2025/KRSA

The Authority approved the proposal for the development of an enhanced version of the simulation based 'Traffic Guru' mobile application at an estimated cost of ₹50,00,000/- (Rupees Fifty Lakh only) including GST for creating road safety awareness and practicing traffic rules through game. The Committee also decided that the application shall be compatible with all major mobile operating system versions and to ensure functionality and relevance for a minimum period of five years.

Gamified Traffic Simulation KIOSK Platform

The Authority approved the proposal for the development of 'gamified traffic simulation KIOSK platform' at an estimate of ₹1,00,00,000/- (Rupees One Crore only) including GST for creating road safety awareness and practicing traffic regulations through simulation based games, to be used in parks, game zones, exhibitions etc.

Awareness Using Animation Character – Additional Fund

File No.A1/904/2024/KRSA

The 48th KRSA meeting held on 23/07/2024 had initially approved Rupees Two crore for the creation of an animation character and various road safety awareness campaigns using it. The Authority decided that if additional fund will be required while the development of the various road safety awareness campaigns, it will be sanctioned only on the basis of specific proposal from the Transport Commissioner with estimate, subject to a ceiling of ₹1,00,00,000/- (Rupees One Crore only) including GST and the Authority allocated the amount for the purpose. Procurement of vehicle for Road Safety Authority.

The Authority noted that the official car of the Road Safety Commissioner is more than 10 years old which is not suitable for long journey of the Commissioner and also presently there is no other own vehicles for KRSA. The Authority approved procuring two vehicles (Innova Crysta) for the Road Safety Authority. (Action by: KRSA)

Safe Kerala-Additional fund for issuing all Challans of Digital Enforcement, for Keltron

File No.A2/1202 /2023/KRSA

10-A) The Authority decided that the Motor Vehicles Department (MVD) should enhance its communication strategy by integrating WhatsApp as an additional mode for delivery of e-challans, considering the widespread penetration and effectiveness of social media platforms.

10-B) The Authority decided to instruct MVD that in cases where the vehicle owner fails to remit the penalty within the prescribed timeframe, a physical copy of the challan also will be dispatched via post, with the associated postal charges to be recovered from the violator and this should be specified in the Challan. The Authority decided that MVD should examine the legal framework for recovering such postal expenses from the non-compliant vehicle owners.

10-C) The Authority also decided to entrust MVD to run a campaign for vehicle owners to update email and Aadhaar linked mobile phone number in the Parivahan database.

10-D) The Authority also decided to instruct MVD to take appropriate measures to improve the user interface of the online payment gateway to facilitate seamless and user-friendly challan payment through google pay etc.

10-E) The Authority agreed the proposal of the Transport Commissioner to Government as per the letter no: E1/360/2023-TC dated 14/11/2024 to allot an additional amount of ₹10,00,00,000/- (Rupees Ten Crore only) per year including GST for sending challans of traffic violations and thereby revising the quarterly payment allocation for the Safe Kerala Project from Rs.11,61,27,514/- to ₹14,11,27,514/- (Rupees Fourteen Crore Eleven Lakh Twenty Seven Thousand Five Hundred and Fourteen only) and to report the decision to Government in reply to Government letter no:D3/383/2024-TRANS dated 13/12/2024.

In order to solve the traffic congestion at Kalady-Maattoor road stretch,Ernakulam district, the Hon'ble Minister for Transport, had visited the site on 24/05/2024, along with the officials of concerned departments including KRSA and suggested some measures to alleviate the congestion.

The Authority allocated sufficient funds subject to a ceiling of ₹1,00,00,000/- (Rupees One Crore only) including GST for the traffic decongestion measures at Kalady- Matoor stretch in Ernakulam district for sanctioning the amount on the basis of specific proposal with detailed estimate as and when received.

The Authority allocated sufficient funds subject to a ceiling of ₹1,50,00,000/- (Rupees One Crore and Fifty Lakh only) including GST for the traffic decongestion measures at Vytilla junction in Ernakulam district for sanctioning the amount on the basis of specific proposal with detailed estimate as and when received.

In the meeting, the Transport Commissioner reported that actually 100 digital tablets will be required to strengthen field-level enforcement operations. Therefore, the Authority decided to procure 100 digital tablets with required specifications at an estimated cost of ₹50,00,000/- (Rupees Fifty Lakh only) including GST for enforcement activities.

The 48th KRSA meeting held on 23/07/2024 decided to sanction ₹9,60,000/- for purchase of cameras with front and rear view for 60 MVD vehicles. Accordingly, the Road Safety Commissioner issued the Administrative Sanction for the

same. But, the Transport Commissioner have submitted another proposal as per the letter no: E1/37/2024-TC dated 25/04/2025 to purchase cameras with front, cabin and rear view for 299 four wheelers at an estimate of ₹1,00,16,500/-. But as per the letter no: M3/68/2024-TC dated 19/05/2025, the existing and sanctioned four wheelers of MVD are only 273. The Authority decided to purchase cameras for the existing and already sanctioned four wheelers at an estimate of ₹33,500/-(Rupees Thirty Three Thousand and Five Hundred only) per camera including GST by cancelling the earlier sanction in this regard. **(Action by: KRSA, MVD)**
